ADVANCED PLACEMENT: 2023 BRIEF SUBJECT:

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The Advanced Placement (AP) program represents a critical element in HISD's efforts to inject rigor into the high school classrooms. This report presents AP exam participation and performance trends for the past five years as well as results from the most recent school year summarized by campus and student groups.

Key Findings:

Participation in AP Exam

- The number of students districtwide taking at least one AP exam increased by 3% from 13,823 in 2022 to 14.257 in 2023.
- The number of AP exams taken districtwide **increased** by 4% from 25,339 in 2022 to 25,452 in 2023.

Performance on AP Exams

- The number of AP exams scored at 3 or higher increased by 18% from 10,484 in 2022 to 11,262 in 2023, and the percentage of exams scored at 3 or higher increased from 41% in 2022 to 44% in 2023.
- The district's AP exampassing rates, scored at 3 or higher, **improved** by three percentage points, while the state's rates only increased by one point in 2023, compared to 2022.
- White students achieved passing rates on the AP exams, scored at 3 or higher, at rates 2.2 and 2.7 percentage points higher than their African American and Hispanic peers, respectively. Between 2022 and 2023, the gap in passing rates between White and African American students decreased by one percent.
- NES and NES-Aligned campuses had significantly lower passing rates (9% and 17%, respectively) compared to non-designated campuses, which had a 48% passing rate.

Performance on AP Scholar Awards

Twenty-one more campuses earned AP Awards in 2023 than in 2022 including five campuses that increased the number of AP Scholar Awards earned by double-digits.

The College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) Program provides participating high school students with the opportunity to take college-level courses and earn college credit, advanced placement, or both. A possible 38 examinations in Arts, AP Capstone, English, History and Social Science, Mathematics and Computer Science, Sciences, and World Languages and Cultures are administered in May at participating schools (for a complete list of examinations in each category, see **Appendix A**, p. 10). As reported by the College Board, most four-year colleges and universities, as well as institutions in 100 other countries grant credit, placement, or both to students receiving a qualifying score (i.e., 3 or higher on a scale of 1 to 5) on an AP exam¹. Studies show that students who take AP courses and exams are more likely to succeed in college². Families may also experience tangential financial benefits if students receive advanced placement, college credit, or both. Other benefits afforded to students include opportunities that lead to scholarships or recognition.

Administration

AP exams are administered each year in May over a two-week period. There is a make-up exam testing period as well as an exception testing period for students who had conflicts with scheduled AP exams. In 2023, AP exams were administered in the traditional paper-and-pen format except the following seven exams - Computer Science Principles, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, European History, Seminar, United States History, and World History were offered in digital format in the following high schools:

Scoring

The final score is reported on a 5-point scale as follows:

- 5 = extremely well qualified
- 4 = well qualified
- 3 = qualified
- 2 = possibly qualified
- 1 = no recommendation

"Qualified", scored at 3 on the 5-point scale, means that the student has demonstrated the capability of doing introductory-level coursework in a particular subject at the college level. Many colleges and

universities grant credit and placement for scores of 3, 4, or 5; however, each college decides which scores it will accept. In this report, scores of 3 or higher are considered for students who pass the AP exams.

Program Costs and Funding Source

The AP exam fees are outlined in **Table 1**. The district pays for all AP exams regardless of a student's family income level. The total costs for the district decreased to \$1,122,452 when compared to the previous year. The AP examination fee was \$97 per exam (minus a \$9 College Board rebate) resulting in an \$88 cost per exam for the 2022–2023 school year. The College Board provides a \$35 fee reduction per exam for students in financial need who qualify. Moreover, the state subsidy per AP exam is \$39 making the total cost \$14 per exam for eligible students for 2022–2023 compared to \$13 per exam for 2021–2022. The cost per AP Seminar and AP Research exam is \$145 and \$62 for students with financial need.

Methods

Data Sources

The College Board receives Advanced Placement (AP) data from the Educational Testing Service (ETS). AP data for the current school year (2022–2023) were downloaded from the College Board portal on August 8, 2023, in the form of electronic files. District demographics and student designations are from the PEIMS Summer submission file, except for the At-Risk data which comes from the PEIMS Fall file. Campus designations are from the Campus Information List (CIL) as of October 2023.

Data Limitations

Due to a high number of missing demographic information from the College Board electronic file as well as data quality errors, district demographic data from PEIMS are used in the analysis. There were discrepancies regarding the campus of enrollment and the campus at which a student was attributed for testing by the College Board. For example, there were ninth to twelfth grade students and students with no grade level that were attributed to middle school campuses and eighth grade students attributed to high schools for AP testing. Data from these students were included in the total numbers but were excluded from campus numbers in campus-level analyses. Data files did not provide any indicator for test format versions; this report will not provide any analysis to investigate any potential differences in performance as affected by different format versions.

Exam Participation and Performance




Figure 1. AP Exam Participation and Performance, Districtwide, 2021–2023

The number of AP exams taken by students districtwide increased to 25,542 in 2023 from 25,339 in 2022. This is a one percent increase from the previous year and a five percent increase from 2021 (Figure 1, p. 3).

Results

• The number of AP exams scored at 3 or higher in 2023 is 11,262, accounting for 44% of the exams taken by students districtwide. This represents an increase of three and eight percentage points compared to 2022 and 2021, respectively (**Figure 1**, p.2).

Comparison with State and Nation




Figure 2. AP Exam Performance (HISD, Texas, National), 8th-12th Grade, 2021-2023

- In 2023, the percentage of exams scored at 3 or higher rose across HISD, state, and national levels; however, HISD showed a slightly higher increase in the percentage of AP exams scored at 3 or higher (three percentage points) compared to the state (one percentage point) (Figure 2).
- The percentage of AP exams scored at 3 or higher in HISD is lower than that of Texas by six percentage points and lower than the nation by 16 percentage points for 2023. These gaps have closed from 2021, where it was nine percentage points for Texas and 18 percentage points for the nation (Figure 2).

By Exam Category

- The proportion of exam categories has remained the same or very similar for the past two school years. 2022-23 AP exam subject categories are outlined in **Appendix A** (p. 10).
- The percentage of exams scored at 3 or higher shows improvement across all seven exam categories, from a one percentage point increase in English and World Languages & Culture, to a 12-percentage point improvement in the Arts exam category (Table 2, p. 4).

By Student Group

- The total number of test-takers, the number of AP exams taken by HISD students, and the number of exams scored at 3 or higher, **increased** in 2023 compared to 2022; similarly, the percentage of exams scored at 3 or higher **increased** from 41 percent in 2022 to 44 percent in 2023 **(Table 3,** p. 5).
- Less than two percent of the students who took AP exams come from NES campuses and only one percent of all AP exams taken were taken in NES campuses. Of the exams taken in NES campuses, nine percent of exams scored at 3 or higher which was the lowest among student groups in 2023; combined with NES-Aligned campuses, passing rates improve to 17% (Table 3, p. 5).
- The number of students who took at least one AP exam increased across all racial/ethnic groups except among African American students. There were 43 fewer African American students who took an AP exam in 2023 compared to 2022. In contrast, the number of Hispanic, White, and Asian student test-takers increased by five, two, and three percent, respectively (**Table 3**, p. 5).
- The percentage of exams that were scored at 3 or higher increased by two to three percent across all major racial/ethnic groups (**Table 3**, p. 5).
- Performance gaps in passing rates exist between African American and Hispanic students compared to their White peers. In 2023, White students achieved qualifying scores on the AP exams more than twice the rates of their African American and Hispanic peers. On a positive note, between 2022 and 2023, the gap in passing rates between White and African American students **decreased** by one percent (**Table 3**, p. 5).
- Sixty-six percent of AP test takers in 2023 were identified as economically disadvantaged students. When compared to 2022, the number of economically disadvantaged students who took AP exams increased, but the number of exams taken slightly decreased. However, the number of exams taken by economically disadvantaged students who scored at 3 or higher increased by eight percent. Noneconomically disadvantaged students passed the AP exam at rates two times higher than economically disadvantaged students (64% vs. 31%) (Table 3, p. 5).
- At-Risk students accounted for 41 percent of AP test takers in 2023. The number of at-risk students who took the test **increased** by 16 percent compared to the previous year. Compared to 2022, the number of at-risk test takers and the number of exams taken increased by more than 10 percent at 16 and 13 percent, respectively. The number of exams scored at 3 or higher for at-risk students increased by 31 percent. Despite these advances, non-at-risk students passed AP exams at almost double the rates than at-risk students (53% vs 27%) (**Table 3**, p. 5).

Equity and Excellence for Seniors

- A total of 17% of 2023 HISD seniors scored at 3 or higher during their high school tenure, reflecting a two percentage-point decrease compared to 2022 (**Table 4**, p. 6).
- A handful of senior student groups showed a slight increase in the percentage of exams scored at 3 or higher: NES, NES-Aligned, and African American students showed one percentage point increases while special education students increased by two percentage points and non-At-risk students increased by four percentage points (Table 4, p. 6).
- Out of the campuses that tested ten or more senior students in 2023, Carnegie High School had 97.2 percent of their enrolled seniors scoring at 3, 4, or 5 on an AP exam during their high school tenure, reflecting the highest percentage of all campuses (**Appendix B–1**, p. 11).

• Of interest are a couple of campuses where the number of students taking AP exams noticeably decreased resulting in fewer than five seniors who tested in 2023 (Lamar HS and Scarborough HS) or no seniors who tested at all (East Early College) (**Appendix B-1**, p. 11).

By Subject

- For 2023, students in HISD scored a mean of 3 or higher on a five-point scale on 14 of the 38 AP subject examinations where five or more students were tested (**Appendix B–2**, p. 12).
- HISD students exceeded the global mean score for six out of 38 subject examinations in Calculus BC, Chinese Language & Culture, Italian Language and Culture, Music Theory, Physics 2, and Physics C-Mechanics (Appendix B–2, p. 12).
- Mean scores ranged from 1.4 in Latin to 4.1 in Calculus BC (Appendix B-2, p. 12).

- World History represented the subject test taken by the highest number of students (N=3,347); however, mean scores for this exam were lower than the global mean scores by 0.7 (Appendix B-2, p. 12).
- The White-African American gap decreased on 11 exams and the White-Hispanic gap decreased on 13 exams (indicated by green arrow) (**Appendix B–3**, p. 13).
- The largest gap decreases between White and African American students and between White and Hispanic students occurred on the Calculus BC exam (**Appendix B-3**, p. 13).
- The White-African American gap increased on 8 exams and White-Hispanic gap increased on 13 exams (shown by red arrow). The largest gap increases between White and African American students and between White and Hispanic students occurred on the Art History exam (**Appendix B–3**, p. 13).

By Campus

- Appendix B-4 (p. 14) shows the number of AP exams taken by HISD students districtwide and the number of exams scored at 3 or higher by campus in 2022 and 2023. Appendix C (p. 15) provides additional details for the number of AP exams taken and the corresponding performance by campus. In both figures, middle schools were combined into one row, while another row accounted for student test-takers whose grade levels were missing or mis-assigned in the data file (for example, eighth graders attributed to a high school campus, or an eleventh grader attributed to a middle school campus).
- Students at Carnegie High School took the largest number of AP exams in 2023 (2,770) while eight exams were taken at Long Academy, reflecting the smallest number of exams taken (Appendix B-4, p. 14).
- In 2023, exams taken at Carnegie, Bellaire, Westside, and DeBakey high schools combined represented 33 percent of all AP exams taken in HISD but accounted for 56 percent of all exams that were scored at 3 or higher (**Appendix B-4**, p. 14).
- For the 44 campuses with two years of **participation** data and five or more testers, 21 campuses **increased** the number of AP exams taken, and 23 campuses **decreased** the number of AP exams taken (**Appendix B-4**, p. 14).
- For the 44 campuses with two years of **performance** data and five or more testers, the number of AP exams scored at 3 or higher **increased** at 24 campuses and **decreased** at 19 campuses, with no change occurring at one campus (**Appendix B–4**, p. 14).

By Exam and by Campus

- AP participation and performance across campuses varies markedly. Among high school campuses where more than 5 students took an AP exam, passing rates ranged from one percent at Kashmere HS to 79 percent at Bellaire High School. Among middle school campuses where more than 5 students took an AP exam, passing rates ranged from three percent at Leland YMCPA to 94 percent at Pershing MS (Appendix D, pp. 16-85).
- In 2023, there were 29 campuses wherein none of the students passed in one or more of the following exams: Biology, Calculus AB, Chemistry, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Music Theory, Physics 1, Psychology, Seminar, Spanish Literature and Culture, Statistics, Studio Art: 3-D Design Portfolio, United States Government and Politics, United States History, and World History (Appendix D, pp. 16-85).

• World History (N=3,347), Spanish Language and Culture (N=2,944), and English Language & Composition (N=2,493), were the top three AP exams with the highest number of testers across the district (Appendix D, pp. 16-85).

"Emerging Scholars" 8th and 9th Grade

• Though AP courses and exams are usually taken by students in grades 10–12, students in middle school and ninth grade are increasingly taking advantage of the opportunity to earn college credits early in their academic careers. The most common exams taken by eighth grade students are Spanish Language and Culture exams. Ninth graders are likely to take Human Geography and Spanish Language and Culture exams. **Table 6** presents AP exam participation and performance for students in grades 8 and 9.

AP Scholar Awards

- The AP Program offers several AP Scholar Awards to recognize high school students who have demonstrated college-level achievement through AP courses and exams. This achievement is acknowledged on any score report that is sent to colleges the following fall. The following AP Scholar Awards are offered by the College Board: AP Scholar, AP Scholar with Honor, AP Scholar with Distinction, AP International Diploma, AP Capstone Diploma, and AP Seminar and Research Certificate. The criteria for receiving these awards are shown in Appendix E-1 (p. 86).
- There was a seven percent increase in the overall number of AP awards across the district in 2023 despite single digit decreases in the AP International Diploma and AP Seminar and Research Certificates (Appendix E-2, p. 87).
- Seventy percent of all AP Awards were earned by students at five campuses: Bellaire HS (19%), Carnegie HS (25%), DeBakey HS (11%), Kinder HSPVA (6%), and Westside HS (9%) (Appendix E-2, p. 87).
- Twenty-one campuses earned more AP Awards in 2023 than in 2022 including six campuses that increased the number of AP Awards earned by double-digits (Appendix E–2, p. 87).

Conclusion

The purpose of this report was to examine the participation and performance of HISD students on Advanced Placement exams and to provide a comparative analysis of current-year AP results with those from previous years, where reasonable. The number of AP exams taken and the number of exams achieving a score of 3 or higher continue to increase. These outcomes are promising, signifying renewed student enthusiasm for the AP program. Considering the advantages that passing AP exams can bring to students in terms of their high school and college academic journeys, as well as the potential cost savings for families and students when qualifying scores result in 'free' college credit, sustaining district support for the AP program is warranted. It is also worth noting that despite the higher volume of exams being taken, the district's associated costs seem to be decreasing over time (see Table 1).

While the number of students from historically underrepresented groups taking AP exams is increasing, specifically among Hispanics and economically disadvantaged students, they are still less likely to pass AP exams compared to their White, Asian, and non-economically disadvantaged peers (see Table 3). Fewer African American students have been taking AP exams, but their increase in passing rates keeps up with other major racial/ethnic groups.

NES and NES-Aligned campuses achieved passing rates that were less than half of the passing rates of non-designated campuses and the district in general. It may be worth reviewing AP course participation and implementation among these campuses to ensure students are getting the resources and support needed to improve AP exam performance.

It might be beneficial to take a closer look at the campuses and exams where none of the test-takers achieved a qualifying score (see Appendix D). A review of how students are prepared, encouraged, and registered for AP exams might provide insight into these instances where no one on a campus passes an exam. Is it a misalignment in course material, a lack of preparation, or students allowed to take a test without previous exposure to the subject matter? Given the potential positive impact passing AP exams provide, the district should ensure resources are available and systems are streamlined to set students up for success.
