SUBJECT: ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP): CLASS OF 2010

The initial results from the Advanced Placement (AP) examinations have been released by the College Board. The Advanced Placement Program provides high school students with the opportunity to take college-level courses and earn college credit. AP exams are administered each year in May over a two-week period. There are a total of 37 AP exams offered in 22 subject areas. The AP grade scale ranges from 1 to 5, and a score of 3 or higher qualifies a student to earn advanced placement, college credit, or both.

The number of HISD students participating in AP exams at the high school level in 2010 was 8,591, an increase of 2,522 students from 2009 when 6,069 students took AP exams. The total number of exams taken by HISD students increased to 16,075 in 2010 from 11,594 in 2009, up by 28 percent, or 4,481 exams. The percent of exams scored at a 3 or higher was 38 percent, a decrease of 4 percentage points from 2009. At the middle school level, 280 students from 12 campuses took AP exams in the areas of Spanish Language, English Language and Composition, and World History. **Tables 1** and **2** depict 2010 and 2009 AP participation and performance data by campus and districtwide. State and global data are not yet available.

A full report analyzing AP exam data by course participation will be available by the end of August, with updated results and with state and global comparisons.
