33 other high schools came from as far as Killeen, Texas to meet the defending Bluebonnet Drill Meet champions, the **BLACK KNIGHTS**. The drill meet is the largest in all southeast Texas consisting of armed and unarmed drill, color guard, physical fitness, swim competition, flag folding, academics, and marksmanship.

Cadets from Texas A&M Corps of Cadets assisted in judging and scoring the competition and they talked with high school cadets about their experiences in college. Houston ISD instructors were the primary judges, and they too would chat with cadets from all over the region to reinforce the reason they were there and that was to become better citizens through patriotic competition.

There could only be one champion. The Houston MSTC Army JROTC 1st Battalion Black Knights brought their "A Game" and put on a masterful performance taking most of the 1st place positions that day. Next year, the Black Knights will seek to "**Three-peat**" at this competition and maintain the competitive edge.
