This pandemic year has been difficult for both teaching and learning. However, teachers and students at the Barbara Jordan Career Center, to borrow an old expression, have made lemonade from lemons. Students completed projects at home in nearly every career path, including Construction Tech and Child Development, pictured to the right. In Engineering Math, students made solar ovens and presented their finished products in-person or virtually. Government/Diplomacy students were still able to work on modules about the National Incident Management System. Cosmetology logged hours for TDLR by working on Cengage lessons. The Cosmetology teachers utilized webcams and in-person student presentations to teach content and skills to virtual students. Additionally, Cosmetology teachers will be available this summer for students to continue accumulating hours toward their Operator License. Senior students in Welding will be completing their final course towards their Structural Welding Certificate at HCC this summer.
