Attached is the College-Bound Assessment Report for 2011–2012. This report provides an analysis of Houston Independent School District (HISD) performance for college-bound students on the 2011–2012 administrations of the Preliminary SAT (PSAT), the SAT Reasoning Test (SAT), the ACT Assessment (ACT), Advanced Placement (AP) exams, and International Baccalaureate (IB) exams. Results were analyzed by race/ethnicity and gender, and state and national data are also presented for comparison purposes. Although most of this information has been provided earlier in separate reports, this report presents all data for the 2011–2012 school year in one place.

- A total of 32,106 HISD freshmen, sophomores and juniors participated in the fall 2011 PSAT/NMSQT. The percent of freshmen, sophomores and juniors who participated increased from 86.2 percent in 2010 to 86.3 percent in 2011.
- For the class of 2012, the number of HISD graduating seniors with SAT results was 9,480, an increase of 3,259 students taking the test from the 6,221 students in 2011. The average composite score decreased from 1355 in 2011 to 1255 in 2012.
- The number of HISD graduating seniors in 2012 with ACT test results was 2,124, a decrease of 568 students taking the test from the 2,692 students in 2011. The average composite score increased from 19.6 in 2011 to 20.5 in 2012.
- For 2012, the number of HISD high school students who participated in AP exams increased from 12,298 in 2011 to 13,403 in 2012. HISD students who took AP exams in 2012 took a total of 23,227 exams, an increase of 1,880 exams from 2011. The percent scoring three or higher in 2012 was 31%, unchanged from 2011.
- In 2012, 1,403 students in HISD took IB exams compared to 1,416 in 2011. 70 percent of the students scored four or higher in 2012 compared to 73 percent in 2011. In 2012, eleven out of thirty-seven IB subjects taken at Bellaire High School and seven out of forty subjects taken at Lamar High School had average scores exceeding the worldwide average.

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# **COLLEGE–BOUND ASSESSMENT REPORT 2011–2012**

This report provides an analysis of Houston Independent School District (HISD) performance for college-bound students on the Preliminary SAT (PSAT), SAT Reasoning Test (SAT), ACT Assessment (ACT), and Advanced Placement exams (AP). In addition, the performance results of students who participated in the International Baccalaureate (IB) testing program are provided. Results by ethnicity and gender are presented for each assessment with the exception of IB, which does not provide results by ethnicity and gender. The results for Texas and the nation are presented for comparison purposes. Campus-level data are included at the end of this report in **Appendix A**.

## **Preliminary SAT (PSAT)**

### **Introduction**

#### **Purpose**

The Preliminary SAT (PSAT) is a national examination administered in October of each year by the College Board. The PSAT has three parts: critical reading, mathematics, and writing skills.

The PSAT serves as preparation for the SAT Reasoning Test. One of the benefits that students receive is a report assessing their performance on the PSAT with suggestions to improve their skills. Another important benefit is that the PSAT serves as a qualifying examination for numerous scholarship programs that are sponsored by corporations, colleges and universities, and other organizations, including the National Merit scholarships. The National Merit Scholarship Program began in 1955. Of the top 50,000 scorers nationwide, approximately 16,000 students qualify yearly as semifinalists for the National Merit Scholarship.

In addition to the National Merit Scholarship finalists, other specific recognition is bestowed to high-scoring Hispanic students through the National Hispanic Scholar Program, and to high scoring African American students through the National Scholarship Service and Fund for Negro Students which provides a National Achievement Scholarship to qualified students.

The College Search Service, which is operated by the Educational Testing Service, represents another important benefit for students who take the PSAT. For the 2011 administration, 69.3 percent of freshmen, 71.1 percent of sophomores, and 80.9 percent of juniors taking the PSAT/NMSQT registered to participate in this search service, by which colleges and universities obtain names and addresses of tested students who meet specific parameters set forth by the colleges, such as geographic location, areas of major interest, and test score range. The colleges then directly contact the students with recruitment information and materials. As a result, the PSAT has come to serve as a vehicle for bringing prospective students to the attention of colleges and universities.

In the fall of 2003, HISD implemented the PSAT Initiative. Through the HISD Foundation, funds were secured to enable the district to fund this proactive initiative by offering the PSAT to all tenth-grade students attending HISD schools in the fall of 2003. This initiative is designed to provide schools with information about sophomores' academic strengths and interests and to aid the district in identifying students with the aptitude for Advance Placement (AP) courses. This initiative also assists the district in preparing students for college entrance exams and enables

students to realize the possibilities of continuing their academic careers after high school. In the fall of 2010, HISD introduced an initiative to provide free PSAT testing for all freshmen.

The College Board (2006, Report No. 2006-1) reports that the PSAT can be utilized to identify students who may be successful in AP courses. Previously, teacher recommendations, self-nomination, previous courses completed, grades in course work, and scores on achievement tests have been successfully used to identify those students that can complete and excel in AP courses. However, this system does not identify all students who could benefit from taking AP courses. The PSAT provides another method of identifying students that can profit academically from enrollment in AP courses. The College Board suggests that teachers and counselors may use expectancy tables, based on PSAT subject area scores and with standards specific to 31 different AP examinations, as an additional predictor of the likelihood of success on AP exams. Schools may elect to use the expectancy tables and AP Potential, which is provided to all schools that administer the PSAT.

### **Administration and Scoring**

The PSAT/NMSQT is a two-hour and ten-minute test. The reading questions are presented in two 25-minute sections. The mathematics questions are also presented in two 25-minute sections for a total of 100 minutes. For the writing section, a total of 30 minutes is allotted for completion. High schools administered the PSAT/NMSQT on their campuses on Wednesday, October 12, 2011. Three scaled scores are generated for each student: a reading score, a mathematics score, and a writing score. Each score ranges from 20 to 80; these numbers are analogous to the scaled scores of 200 to 800 generated by the SAT. Nationally, the average reading, mathematics, and writing scores are nearing the midpoint (50) of the 20 to 80 scale.

### **Participants**

A total of 32,106 HISD students in grades 9–11 participated in the fall 2011 PSAT/NMSQT. The percent of sophomores and juniors who participated increased from 86.2 percent in 2010 to 86.3 percent in 2011. The percent of students in grades 9 through 11 who participated in the fall of 2011 was 85.5 percent. With a new districtwide initiative to test ninth graders, a total of 12,312 freshmen took the PSAT in the fall of 2011. The number of sophomores taking the PSAT/NMSQT decreased by 598 students from the previous year, and the number of juniors tested increased by 27 students. The number of HISD campuses participating in the PSAT/NMSQT in the fall of 2011 was 42, a decrease from 46 campuses in 2010.

## **Results**

### **Districtwide Performance**

Analysis of districtwide performance focused on the results of freshman, sophomores, juniors, and the combined performance of these three groups. Results from the fall of 2010 and 2011 PSAT are presented in **Table 1**. The averages of student critical reading, mathematics, and writing scores were calculated and analyzed to describe student performance.

- A total of 32,106 students participated in the fall 2011 PSAT. Participants included 12,312 freshmen, 10,632 sophomores, and 9,162 juniors.
- The mean scores of freshmen on the PSAT in 2011 were 34.7 in reading, 36.1 in mathematics, and 35.0 in writing. HISD freshmen improved their average performance from 2010 to 2011 on the writing section of the PSAT.
- The mean scores of sophomores on the PSAT in 2011 were 37.0 in reading, 39.1 in mathematics, and 36.7 in writing. HISD sophomores improved their average performance from 2010 to 2011 on the writing section of the PSAT.
- The mean scores of juniors on the PSAT in 2011 were 40.1 in reading, 42.3 in mathematics, and 39.8 in writing. HISD juniors' average performance increased from 2010 to 2011 on the writing section of the PSAT.

### **Race/Ethnicity and Gender**

A demographic comparison of fall 2010 and 2011 PSAT participation and mean scores for freshmen, sophomores and juniors is presented. The mean scores on the PSAT for the following subgroups: African American, Asian American, Hispanic, White, female, and male are presented in **Table 2**.

- In 2011, White freshmen reported the highest mean scores on the reading test and writing tests of 45.3 and 43.3, respectively, and Asian American students had the highest mean of 48.2 in mathematics.
- In 2011, White sophomores reported the highest mean scores on the reading and writing tests of 49.1 and 46.6, respectively, and Asian American students had the highest mean score of 52.2 in mathematics.
- In 2011, White juniors reported the highest mean scores on the reading and writing tests of 52.4 and 50.2, respectively, and Asian American students had the highest mean score of 55.4 in mathematics.
- When compared to 2010 PSAT results, the combined grade level results in reading showed decreases for the All Students as well as the Hispanic and male subgroups in 2011, while African American and Asian American students showed increases, and White and female students showed no change.
- In mathematics, the combined results decreased for all student groups in 2011 compared to 2010.
- In writing, the combined results increased for all student groups in 2011 compared to 2010.
- In all classes, females outperformed males on the reading and writing sections of the fall 2011 PSAT, while males outperformed females on the mathematics section.

The fall 2010 and 2011 PSAT mean scores for the reading, mathematics, and writing sections were also examined to determine the achievement gap between Hispanic and African American student groups and their White counterparts. The districtwide differences in mean scores were calculated for freshmen, sophomores, juniors, and the combined classes. These results are presented in **Table 3**.

The largest achievement gaps for each test are highlighted.

- In fall 2011, the largest achievement gap in reading for freshmen was between Hispanic and White students at -11.9 points. On the mathematics section, the largest achievement gap was between African American and White students at -10.4, and in writing, the largest gap was between Hispanic and White students at -9.2 points.
- In fall 2011, the largest achievement gap in reading for sophomores was between Hispanic and White students at -13.8. On the mathematics section, the largest achievement gap was -12.5 between African American and White students. The African American-White and Hispanic-White achievement gaps on the writing section were identical at -11.3 points.
- In fall 2011, the largest achievement gap in reading for juniors was between White and Hispanic students at -14.1 points. On the mathematics section, the largest achievement gap was between African American and White students at -14.3, and in writing, the largest gap was between African American and White students at -12.0.
- From 2010 to 2011, the achievement gaps between African American and White students for all classes declined in reading and writing.

### HISD, Texas, and Nation

A comparison of HISD sophomores and juniors to their counterparts in Texas and the nation is presented in **Table 4**. Freshmen are not included for comparison because the College Board does not produce a national or state data summary report for ninth graders.

- When comparing the performance of HISD sophomores from 2010 to 2011, the mean reading score decreased by 0.1 points, the mean mathematics score fell 1.1 points, and the mean writing score went up 1.2 points.
- Scores for sophomores in the state of Texas increased in reading and writing over the same time period, while their mathematics scores declined.
- The national average scores for sophomores decreased in reading and math but increased for writing from 2010 to 2011. Since the fall of 2010, HISD sophomores have narrowed the gap between their performance and that of their state and national counterparts in math and writing.

The reading gap for sophomores between HISD and the state and HISD and the nation has increased from 2010 to 2011.

- The average performance of HISD juniors in the fall of 2011 was down 0.3 points in reading from 2010, down 1.1 points in mathematics, and up 1.0 in writing.
- Scores for juniors in the state of Texas declined in math, increased in writing, and remained the same in reading, while the national average scores for juniors increased in reading and writing and decreased in math over the same time period.
- Since the fall of 2010, the performance gaps in reading have increased between HISD juniors and that of their state and national counterparts. The mathematics gap has decreased between HISD juniors and the state juniors but has increased between HISD juniors and their national counterparts since 2010.
- The writing gap for juniors between HISD and the state has increased from 2010 to 2011, whereas the writing gap between HISD juniors and their national counterparts has decreased.

### **College Readiness Benchmark**

The PSAT/NMSQT College Readiness Benchmark is the score on each section that a student should meet or exceed to be considered on track to be college ready. Separate benchmarks are provided for sophomores and juniors.

The College Readiness Benchmark has been added to PSAT/NMSQT reporting to help educators have a better understanding of how many and also which students are on track to have the skills necessary for success in college. Equipped with this information, educators can support students who need extra help while there is still time for improvement.

The PSAT/NMSQT College Readiness Benchmark is part of a series of indicators that help educators gauge college readiness at different points in a student's career. It was developed based on the SAT College Readiness Index, which was computed as part of an SAT validity study. The PSAT/NMSQT College Readiness Benchmark is also aligned to a ReadStep indicator that was available beginning in spring 2011. For juniors, the PSAT/NMSQT benchmarks the score associated with a 65 percent likelihood of meeting the SAT benchmark; for sophomores, it is the score associated with a 65 percent likelihood of meeting the junior PSAT/NMSQT benchmark. Note that these benchmarks have been changed starting with the 2012-2013 to conform to the SAT benchmark where there is 65% likelihood that the college freshmen year GPA (FYGPA) will be 2.67 or higher.

**HISD PSAT Benchmark Comparison**

The PSAT/NMSQT college readiness benchmarks for grades 10 and 11 for each subject is presented in **Table 5**. A comparison of HISD 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students meeting the PSAT/NMSQT college readiness benchmarks in 2010 and 2011 is presented in **Table 6**.

## SAT Reasoning Test (SAT)

### Introduction

#### Purpose

The SAT Reasoning Test (SAT) is a college-entrance exam developed by the College Board. The SAT provides a standard by which the skills of students applying for colleges and universities can be compared nationally. Standardized tests are designed to allow college admissions officers to judge all students by a common measuring stick. Standardized test scores compensate for the uncertainty surrounding high school grades, school-to-school differences, grade inflation, and teaching quality, for example. In addition, admissions officers use these scores as a way to predict academic performance in the first year of college. Educational organizations recognize scores on the SAT as useful indicators of college readiness and valid predictors of college success.

#### Description

The SAT is designed to measure developed verbal and mathematical reasoning abilities related to successful performance in college. The SAT was redesigned for 2005, and the first administration of the new test was given on March 12, 2005. Changes included the addition of third-year college-preparatory mathematics, more critical reading selections, and a writing section. The SAT is a three-hour and twenty-minute exam. There are nine sections: three in critical reading, three in mathematics, and three in writing, including a twenty-five minute essay.

#### Administration

The test is administered seven times per year nationwide. Most students take the SAT at national administrations during their junior and senior years in high school. Colleges use SAT scores to make admission decisions, recruit students, place students in appropriate courses, and predict student performance at the college-level; however, they are intended to supplement student records. Starting with the Spring of 2011, HISD funds a school-day administration of the SAT for all juniors. The class of 2012 was the first graduating class to have the school-day testing opportunity as juniors.

#### Scoring

In order to get an SAT raw score, a fraction of the multiple-choice questions answered incorrectly is subtracted from the number answered correctly. If that resulting score is a fraction, it is rounded to the nearest whole number --  $\frac{1}{2}$  or more is rounded up; less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  is rounded down. The raw score is then changed into a scaled score by a statistical process called equating. Equating adjusts for slight differences in difficulty between test editions and ensures that a score on one edition of a test reflects the same ability as a score on another edition and that the score does not depend on how well others did on the same edition. Scores for the critical reading, mathematics, and writing sections range from 200 to 800. A combined score is calculated by adding the section scores together. A 2400 is the highest possible combined score. The critical reading and mathematics sections of the new SAT correspond to the verbal and mathematics sections of the previous version of the SAT.

## Participants

The number of HISD graduating seniors in 2012 with SAT results was 9,480, an increase of 3,259 students taking the test from the 6,221 students in 2011. This is due, in large part, to the HISD funding a school-day administration of the SAT for all juniors which began in the Spring of 2011.

## Districtwide Performance

Districtwide results were summed and calculated to determine the number of students tested, the mean verbal score, the mean mathematics score, the mean writing score, and the combined score for the SAT. **Table 7** presents districtwide results for the classes of 2001 through 2012.

- The number of HISD graduating seniors in 2012 with SAT results was 9,480, an increase of 3,259 (52.4%) from 2011.
- The average critical reading score decreased 35 points in 2012 to 410. The average score on the mathematics subtest decreased by 31 points in 2012 to 439, and the average writing test score decreased by 34 points in 2012 to 406.
- In 2012, the average composite score for the three subtests was 1255, down from 1355 in 2011.

## Race/Ethnicity and Gender

A demographic comparison of SAT participation and mean scores for the HISD classes of 2011 and 2012 are presented in **Table 8**. The mean scores on the SAT for the following subgroups: American Indian, Asian American, African American, Hispanic, White, and other are examined. The College Board provides data for “Puerto Rican,” “Mexican or Mexican American,” and “Other Hispanic, Latino, or Latin American” student groups, and these data are combined for district

results for the Hispanic student group. In addition, SAT scores of students who did not indicate their race/ethnicity are provided.

- There was a 54.5% increase in the total number of students tested from 2011 to 2012.
- The average critical reading SAT scores for students in all ethnic groups decreased from 2011 to 2012. The decreases ranged from 16 points for the White students to a decrease of 92 points reported by the “no response” student group.
- The average mathematics SAT score decreased for all student groups from 2011 to 2012. The decreases range from 17 points reported by the African American students to 62 points reported by the American Indian students.
- The average writing SAT score for students in all groups decreased from 2011 to 2012, with decreases ranging from 16 points reported by the White students to 81 points reported by the “no response” group.
- Both the number of female and male students tested on the SAT increased from 2011 to 2012, with the number of female students tested increasing by 41% and the number of males tested increasing by 67%.
- The average scores on the critical reading, mathematics, and writing SAT tests decreased from 2011 to 2012 for both female and male students. Female students in the class of 2012 outperformed their male counterparts in reading and writing, while males outscored females in mathematics.

The SAT scores for the critical reading and mathematics sections were also examined to determine the difference between the performances of student groups. Expressly, the achievement gap between minority student groups, Hispanic and African American students, and their White counterparts was examined. The districtwide differences in average scores were calculated for 2011 and 2012. These results are presented in **Table 9**.

- The achievement gaps increased for all three subtests of the SAT from 2011 to 2012 between White students and both their African American and Hispanic counterparts. On the SAT reading test, the achievement gap increased by 9 points and 13 points between White and African American students and between White and Hispanic students, respectively. Achievement gaps in math decreased by 1 point between White and African American students, and increased by 8 points between White and Hispanic students, respectively.
- The largest achievement gap between White students and their minority counterparts on all sections of the 2012 SAT was between White and African American students in reading, with a gap of 156 points.

### HISD, Texas, and Nation

A comparison of HISD students on the SAT to their counterparts in Texas and in the nation for the graduating classes of 2011 and 2012 is presented in **Table 10**.

- From 2011 to 2012, the average critical reading SAT score for HISD decreased by 35 points, the average mathematics score decreased by 31 points, and the average writing score decreased by 34 points. Mean scores for Texas decreased in 2011 by 5 points in reading, 3 points in mathematics, and 4 points in writing. For the nation, scores declined by



1 point in reading, were unchanged in mathematics, and declined by 1 point in writing from 2011 to 2012.

- Performance gaps between the district and the state and nation increased for the class of 2011 as compared with the class of 2012. The largest increase between HISD and Texas was in critical reading and writing where the performance gaps increased by 30 points each in 2012. The largest increase between HISD and the nation was in reading where the performance gap increased by 34 points, from a 52-point gap in 2011 to an 86-point gap in 2012.

## **ACT Assessment (ACT)**

### **Introduction**

#### **Purpose**

The founders of the ACT established the American College Testing Program in 1959. The program, which evolved from the Iowa Tests of Educational Development at the University of Iowa, was used to help students make better decisions regarding their postsecondary education and to provide more information to colleges. Colleges use the data to help them plan their curricula and place students in the appropriate courses of study. In late 1996, they changed their name from the American College Testing Program to ACT. The ACT is a national college-admission exam. It assesses both the general educational level of high school students and their readiness for college-level work.

#### **Description**

The ACT consists of four tests: English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning. The tests are curriculum-based and universally accepted by U.S. colleges and universities. The test takes two hours and 55 minutes. There are 75 questions on the English test, 60 questions on the mathematics, 40 questions on the reading, and 40 questions on the science test.

#### **Administration**

The ACT is administered five times per year nationally in October, December, February, April, and June. In selected states, the ACT is also offered in late September. Most students take the ACT during the winter or spring of their junior year, saving the fall of their senior year for retesting, if necessary.

#### **Scoring**

The ACT assessment takes raw scores and converts them to scale scores that have the same meaning for all forms of the tests. The scale scores range from 1 to 36 for each of the four tests and for the composite. The composite is the average of the four test scores, rounded to the nearest whole number. A 36 is the highest possible composite score.

#### **Participants**

The number of Houston Independent School District (HISD) graduating seniors in 2012 with ACT test results was 2,124, a decrease of 568 students taking the test from the 2,692 students in 2011. The participation rate of HISD students on the ACT is generally lower than the participation rate of students on the SAT.

### **Results**

#### **Districtwide Performance**

Districtwide figures were summed and calculated to determine the number of students tested and the mean English, mathematics, reading, science reasoning, and composite scores. Results for the graduating classes of 2001 through 2012 on the ACT are presented in **Table 11**.

- The class of 2012 experienced an increase in mean scores for all of the sections of the ACT assessment compared to the class of 2011. The composite score for HISD students increased from 19.6 in 2011 to 20.5 in 2012.
- The highest mean score on any subtest of the ACT for graduating seniors in 2012 was reported on the math test, with a score of 21.4.
- Over the last twelve years, the composite ACT score has ranged from a low of 18.5 in 2002 to a high of 20.5 in 2012.

### Race/Ethnicity and Gender

A demographic comparison of the ACT mean scores for the classes of 2011 and 2012 is presented. The mean scores on the ACT for the following subgroups, African American, Asian American, Mexican American, and White are presented in **Table 12**.

- All student groups in the class of 2012 except for Asian American students in English and Science showed increases in performance from the class of 2011 on the ACT.
- The highest mean scores on all sections of the ACT for the class of 2012 were reported by the White and Asian American student groups, while the lowest mean scores on all sections of the ACT were reported by African American students.
- The average ACT scores for both female and male students increased from 2011 to 2012 for all subject areas. Female students outperformed their male counterparts in English on the 2011 ACT, while males outperformed females on the mathematics, reading, and science tests and on the mean composite score.

### HISD, Texas, and Nation

A comparison of HISD students on the ACT to their counterparts in Texas and the nation for the graduating classes of 2011 and 2012 is presented in **Table 13**.

- While the average ACT scores have increased in 2012 from 2011 in HISD, the nation failed to make any gains in reading, mathematics and science, and decreased by 0.1 in English.
- The average ACT scores for Texas decreased by 0.1 points in mathematics from 2011 to 2012, increased by 0.1 points in reading, while the English, science and the composite scores remained the same.
- The largest performance gaps between HISD and the nation for 2012 were on the English and reading sections, with HISD trailing the nation by 1.1 points in English and by 1 point in reading. The largest performance gap between HISD and Texas for 2012 was in reading and science, with HISD trailing the state by 0.5 points in each of these sections.

## **Advanced Placement (AP)**

### **Introduction**

#### **Purpose**

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program was established in 1955 as a cooperative educational endeavor between secondary schools and colleges and universities. Since its inception in 1955, the program has provided high school students with the opportunity to take college-level courses and earn college credit. The courses are equivalent to a first-year college course and are taught by highly qualified teachers. Most American colleges and universities accept AP courses with qualifying exam grades towards college credit, advanced placement, or both. In addition, nearly 300 universities outside the United States use AP courses and exam grades in the admissions process (The College Board, 2003).

#### **Description**

There are a total of 37 AP exams offered in 22 subject areas. AP exams are created by a committee of experienced AP secondary school teachers and university professors who specialize in each of the subjects for which an exam is offered. The format of AP exams includes a multiple-choice section and a free-response (essay or problem-solving) section. The exceptions to this format are the AP exams for Studio Art, which is a portfolio assessment, Music Theory, which includes a sight-singing task, and the modern language exam, which includes a speaking component.

#### **Administration**

The Educational Testing Services (ETS) mails out the AP exams along with other exam-related materials to participating schools in April or early May. The AP exams are administered each year in May over a two-week period. Once testing is completed, all AP exams are returned to ETS.

#### **Scoring**

The AP grade scale ranges from 1 to 5. A score of 1 indicates “no recommendation,” a score of 2 “possibly qualified,” a score of 3 “qualified,” a score of 4 “well qualified,” and a score of 5 indicates “extremely well qualified.” The multiple-choice section of the exam is scored by computer. The free-response section is scored by trained readers during a week-long scoring session held in June. These readers who are made up of AP teachers and university professors follow detailed scoring guidelines. Each AP exam has a formula for combining the scores of the multiple-choice and free-response sections of the exam into a composite score. A score of 3 qualifies a student to earn advanced placement or college credit.

#### **Participants**

The number of HISD high school students who participated in AP exams increased from 12,298 in 2011 to 13,403 in 2012. The 13,403 HISD students who took AP exams in 2012 took a total of 23,227 exams, an increase of 1,880 exams from 2011. The percent of exams scored at a 3 or higher was 31 percent, unchanged from 2011. District data for 2011 and 2012 were drawn from the August electronic files provided by the College Board, which represent the most current data available at the time and only included exams taken by HISD high school students.

## Results

### Districtwide Performance

Districtwide results were summed and calculated to determine the number of AP exams, and the percent scoring 3 or above. **Table 14** presents districtwide results for the years 2001 through 2012.

- The number of AP exams that HISD students have taken over the last decade has increased from 3,769 in 2001 to 23,227 in 2012. The number of students taking the AP exam has increased from 1,968 in 2001 to 13,403 in 2012.
- The percent of scores at 3 or above declined from a peak of 60 percent in 2003 to a low of 31 percent in 2011 and 2012 as the participation in AP exams increased more than fivefold during 2003-2012.

### Race/Ethnicity and Gender

A demographic comparison of the AP participation and the percent of scores at 3 or above for 2011 and 2012 are presented. The scores on AP exams for the following student groups, American Indian, Asian American, African American, Hispanic, White, and other, are presented in **Table 15**.

- From 2011 to 2012, the number of AP exams taken increased for each student group in HISD except for Asian American students. Over the same time period, the percent of exams scored at 3 or above increased for students in the American Indian, “other”, and the “no response” student groups.
- The highest number of AP exams taken was by Hispanic students who took a total of 12,047 exams, followed by African American students who took 4,317 exams.
- Asian American students had the highest percentage of exams scored at 3 or above at 67 percent while the African American students had the lowest at 13 percent.
- The number of AP exams taken by female and male students increased from 2011 to 2012. In 2012, female students took 2,291 more AP exams than male students. The percentage of exams scored 3 or above decreased by one percent from 2011 to 2012 for both female and male students.

**HISD, Texas, and Nation**

A comparison of HISD students on AP exams to their counterparts in Texas and the nation for students tested in 2011 and 2012 is presented in **Table 16**.

- From 2011 to 2012, the number of AP exams taken increased by 9 percent in HISD, 4 percent in Texas, and 7 percent nationally.
- The percent of exams scored at 3 or above in 2012 compared to 2011 remained unchanged in HISD, increased by 3 percent in Texas, and increased by 2 percent nationally.



## **International Baccalaureate (IB)**

### **Introduction**

#### **Purpose**

The International Baccalaureate Organization is a nonprofit international educational organization established in 1968. This organization offers the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme for students aged 16-19. The IB Diploma Programme is a two-year course of study that prepares students for college. The IB Diploma Programme is recognized and accepted by universities around the world. Similar to the AP program, students with high scores on IB exams can earn college credit or advanced placement at a college or university.

#### **Description**

Students participating in the IB Diploma Programme are required to take six exams which are in the following subject groups: literature, language, social science, experimental science, mathematics, and art. The students may choose to replace the art exam by a second social science, experimental science, or a third language. Students test in three of their subjects at the higher level and three of their subjects at the subsidiary level. IB exams are developed by an international board of chief examiners, with input from IB teachers from around the world (IBO, 2004). Students may also choose to take individual IB courses and the exams.

In addition, students must fulfill three additional requirements. They must take a critical thinking class known as “Theory of Knowledge,” complete an original 4,000 word research project known as “Extended Essay,” and participate in a minimum of 150 hours of community service, artistic, and physical activities known as “Creativity, Action, and Service.”

#### **Administration**

IB exams are administered to students at their high school in two sessions. The first session takes place in November, and the second session takes place in May. IB exams are administered over a period of two weeks.

#### **Scoring**

An international body of 3,500 trained IB examiners composed of university professors and master secondary school teachers score the IB exams. An examining board oversees the scoring of the examiners to ensure that scoring is consistent across subjects and across the world. Final scores are given in each subject at the IB Curriculum and Assessment Center in Wales. Each exam is graded on a scale of 1 to 7. Students who earn a score of 4 or higher on an IB exam will be awarded an IB certificate in that subject area. Students must complete the requirements stated previously and achieve a cumulative score of 24 to be awarded the IB Diploma. Results are released each year in July.

#### **Participants**

Two HISD high schools participated in the IB program in 2011 and 2012. These schools are Bellaire and Lamar high schools. The total number of students who participated in the IB exams decreased from 504 students in 2011 to 499 students in 2012. Of the two participating schools, Lamar High School had more students who took an IB exam.

## Results

### Districtwide Performance

Districtwide results were summed and calculated to determine the number of IB exams taken and the percent scoring 4 or above. **Table 17** presents results for the participating schools, Bellaire and Lamar, for 2011 and 2012.

- The number of exams taken at Bellaire High School decreased from 146 in 2011 to 137 exams in 2012. The percent of exams scored at 4 or above increased from 86 percent in 2011 to 90 percent in 2012.
- The number of exams taken at Lamar High School decreased from 1,270 in 2011 to 1,266 in 2012. The percent of exams scored at 4 or above decreased from 71 percent in 2011 to 67 percent in 2012.

### HISD, Texas, and Nation

A comparison of HISD students on IB exams to their counterparts in Texas and in the nation for 2010 and 2011 is presented in **Table 18**.

- The percent of HISD exams scored at 4 or above in 2012 was 70 percent, a decrease of three percent from 2011, and which was one percentage point higher than the state and the nation in 2011.
- The number of IB exams taken in HISD decreased from 1,416 in 2011 to 1,403 in 2012.

- Students from Bellaire High School took 37 different IB exams in 2012, and on 11 of those exams or 30 percent, the average score was higher for Bellaire students than the average scores worldwide.
- In 2012, students at Lamar High School took 40 different IB exams. On 7 of those subject exams, or 18 percent, the average score for Lamar students was higher than the average score worldwide.
