COMPENSATORY EDUCATION HOME INSTRUCTION (CEHI)

What is Compensatory Education Home Instruction?

A. CEHI is a homebound service that a student may receive during the prenatal and postpartum periods to help her adjust academically.

When are you eligible to receive CEHI Services?

- A. 1. Day one after you deliver the baby.
 - 2. Any time before you deliver the baby. (Medical documentation is required.)

How can you receive CEHI Services?

- A. Contact the campus nurse or designee:
 - 1. After you deliver the baby.
 - 2. When your pregnancy ends.

What are the requirements to receive CEHI homebound instruction?

- A. 1. A responsible adult (age 18 and over) must be present during each instructional session.
 - 2. The student must reside in a household within the **HISD District** during instruction.

How many CEHI hours do you receive each week?

- A. **Regular Education Students**: Will receive **four hours** of face-to-face instruction per week.
- B. **Special Education Students:** Will receive **six hours** of face-to-face instruction per week.

Core Classes Only

An ARD meeting for the Special Education students must take place indicating the student will receive PRS/CEHI Services before CEHI services are provided.

How will the campus receive my grades and attendance during CEHI Instruction?

- A. The CEHI teacher will submit all grades and attendance weekly to your campus.
- B. You will only be counted "**Present**" for the days you have face-to-face instruction with the CEHI teacher.

Compensatory Education Home Instruction

What CEHI Services are available?

A. 1. <u>Prenatal Confinement:</u> Eligible to receive homebound instruction before you deliver the baby.

(Medical documentation is required.)

- **2.** <u>Postpartum Confinement:</u> Eligible to receive six weeks of homebound instruction after you deliver the baby.
- **3.** Extended Confinement: Eligible to receive an additional four weeks of homebound instruction for a total of ten weeks.

(Medical documentation is required.)

4. Break-In-Service Confinement:

Student Recovery Period/ First Confinement: Eligible to receive six weeks of homebound instruction after you deliver the baby.

(Return to School after the six weeks)

Baby Recovery Period/ Second Confinement: Eligible to receive an additional **four weeks** of homebound instruction after the baby is released from the hospital.

Medical documentation is required.

This option is designed for student's whose baby remain in the hospital after delivery.
