Purpose

A strong partnership between the school and home is essential if a quality educational program is to be provided to all students. - ✓ The school will mandate that teachers hold at least two parent-teacher conferences annually (one in the fall and one in the spring). At these conferences, teachers will review grade-level content standards, student assessments, and progress data with parents. Parents will also have opportunities for regular meetings relating to their children's education when requested.
