Fonwood Early Childhood Center Parent Engagement Policy

PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Fonwood Early Childhood Center agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

• Consistent with section 1118, the school will work to ensure that the required school level parental involvement policies meet the requirements of section 1118 of the ESEA, and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with section 1118(d) of the ESEA.

• Fonwood Early Childhood Center will notify parents of the policy in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand. 1. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1118 of the ESEA:

3. 4. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will provide parents of participating children information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by:

- a) On December 16, 2024, Parents will receive a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students to meet.
- b) Documents will be posted on the school webpage for parents and community members to review.

5. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:

a) Presenting parent/guardian suggestions and concerns to staff and administration

b) Holding meetings to develop a plan of action and to check success of implementation

6. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:

a) During Family Academic Mentors Engage meetings teachers will provide parents with individual student reports about the performance of their child on the state assessment in all subject areas. Family Academic Mentors Engage meeting are held three times throughout the school year.

7. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Title I Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by:

8. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding the following topics:

a) the state's academic content standards,

- b) the state's student academic achievement standards,
- c) the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
- d) the requirements of Part A,
- e) how to monitor their child's progress, and
- f) how to work with educators:

9. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:

a) During Academic Parent Teacher Meeting parents will be provided with literacy and mathematics materials to work with their child at home to improve their children's academic achievement.

10. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:

a) Fonwood Early Childhood will work closely with the Houston Independent School District Family Engagement Department to implement the Family Friendly School Program to educate its teachers, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners.

11. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with Head Start, Reading First, Early Reading First, Even Start, Home Instruction Programs for Preschool Youngsters, the Parents as Teachers Program, public preschool, and other programs. The school will also conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:

a) Fonwood Early Childhood Center will work closely with its onsite Head Start program to integrate parental involvement programs.

12. Fonwood Early Childhood Center will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:

a) Fonwood Early Childhood will provide weekly newsletters and Class Dojo posts that include information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities in the language of the parent.
