# Home to Stop, Ride Times and Ridership Targets



## Home to Stop

Zoned Students = Up to 2 miles

Magnet Students = Up to 3 miles



## Target Ride Times

Zoned Students = 50 min or less

Magnet Students = 80 min or less



## Ridership Targets

30+ for 60+ passenger vehicle

15+ for 20-30 passenger vehicle

## Parent Driven Transportation Requests

We are removing the school as the "middle man".

Parents will receive preview communications and make requests via survey beginning in May.

# Public Transit

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All HS students who request and are eligible for transportation will receive the option of either 1) a bus route or 2) a METRO transit pass.



Attendance expectations must be met to use the public transit option.



# Parent Payment Options

- Special Education students who receive transportation as a related service (according to IEP) AND live 7+ miles from their school will have the option of either 1) a bus route or 2) parent payment for transit to/from school at the rate of \$30 per day.
- Attendance expectations must be met to use the parent payment option.

# SWD Integration

- We will establish a continuum of options for special education students who receive transportation as a related service.

# What is Depth & Complexity

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HISD serves a diverse student population with varying academic abilities and interests. Depth and Complexity provides a structured approach to differentiate instruction, ensuring that all students, including gifted learners and those needing additional support, are challenged appropriately.

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Promoting Critical Thinking: The framework encourages students to think deeply and critically about content, fostering a classroom environment where inquiry and intellectual curiosity are paramount.

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Enhancing Engagement: By making lessons more engaging and relevant, Depth and Complexity helps students connect their learning to real-world issues and diverse perspectives, increase motivation and participation.

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# Alignment to Texas State Plan

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Texas State Plan states:

*Districts meet the needs of gifted/talented students by modifying the depth, complexity, and pacing of the curriculum and instruction ordinarily provided by the school.*

*(Curriculum & Instruction, Texas State Plan 2024)*





# How can D & C enhance HQI (not replace)

- **Promotes Critical Thinking and Inquiry:** The framework uses icons to represent various thinking styles—such as patterns and ethical considerations—encouraging students to explore topics more deeply.
- **Differentiates Instruction for Diverse Learners:** Teachers can tailor lessons to meet the individual needs of students, ensuring everyone is appropriately challenged and engaged.
- **Supports Independent Thinking:** Emphasizing critical thinking and complex reasoning helps students develop skills for analyzing information and making informed decisions.



# How will we measure the impact?

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## Monitoring the effectiveness of Depth and Complexity training and resources

**Check for Understanding:** Include a formal check for understanding after each training session to evaluate teachers' understanding and application of the framework in their classrooms.

**Classroom Observations:** Perform classroom observations to ensure that Depth and Complexity strategies are being implemented effectively and to provide feedback for improvement.

**Teacher Feedback:** Collect feedback from teachers on the training process and its impact on their instructional practices, using surveys and focus groups.

**Systems Checks:** G/T department will continue systems checks to evaluate G/T services and implementation.
