The Houston Independent School District (HISD) has received the results for the December 2020 administration of the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness End-of-Course (STAAR EOC) exams. These exams are a graduation requirement and were given to eligible students who did not meet the satisfactory level of performance in previous administrations (retesters), as well as students who completed a course and tested for the first time.

Under House Bill 5 (HB 5), passed by the 83rd Texas Legislature, high school students are required to pass five STAAR EOC assessments to meet the graduation requirements. These five assessments include Algebra I, English I, English II, Biology, and U.S. History.

Due to COVID-19, the EOC graduation requirement was waived for students who earned a corresponding course credit during the spring or summer of 2020. This reduced the total number of fall retesters – particularly first-time retesters, in addition, all students who attempted a fall EOC assessment were required to test in-person at a monitored testing session. Interpretation of results and comparisons to prior years should be made with caution.

Key findings include:

- There were 9,133 fewer EOC assessments given in December 2020 than in December 2019 (From 15,094 to 5,961 assessments). (Table 2)
- The percentage of students performing at or above the Approaches Grade Level Standard range from 22% (English I & II) to 64% (U.S. History). (Table 1)
- For Biology, English II, and US History, the percentage of students performing at or above the Approaches Grade Level Standard increased when compared to the December 2019 results. (Table 2)
- Most of the students who tested in December were English I or English II retesters. (Figure 1)
- Of the 5,961 STAAR EOC tests administered in December 2020, 9 percent (511 tests) were taken by ninth-grade students, 17 percent (1,008 tests) were taken by tenth-grade students, 36 percent (2,140 tests) were taken by eleventh-grade students, and 39 percent (2,296 tests) were taken by twelfth-grade students. Administrative Responses to the December 2020 STAAR EOC results:

The Secondary Curriculum and Development department continues to revise and develop curriculum resources, with an emphasis on newly adopted standards, academic vocabulary, and asynchronous instruction. Teacher Development Specialists (TDS) continue to support teachers through student-centered coaching, where a purposeful focus on data and student work allows teachers to make informed decisions about instruction that is differentiated and needs-based.

In addition to prioritizing the development of review resources based on the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS), the department has expanded its partnership with the Office of Special Education to give guidance to curriculum writers and TDS around universal design for learning (UDL) principles and specially designed instruction (SDI). This work is transferred through the training of co-teachers on how to use our lessons to support all learners. We are continuously updating materials to support HISD students, including the writing toolkit, review materials, and additional training for teachers, Tier II leaders, and principals.

Additional partnerships have been expanded with the Office of Academic Instructional Technology. Given the impact the COVID-19 pandemic has had on teaching and learning, we continue to make concerted efforts toward coaching teachers on how to deliver quality instruction in an asynchronous, synchronous, or concurrent format. Every core-content area team has a TDS dedicated to enhancing all curriculum materials with tools, resources, and strategies that yield the effective integration of technology.

A few of the resources designed to ensure that data-driven best practices for interventions are in place at all secondary schools are highlighted below:

- End-of-Course (EOC) Master Course Review Units and HUB Guide Courses
- EOC Pathways Afforded by Adopted/Purchased Digital Resources (i.e., Imagine Math, Active Classroom for Social Studies and ExploreLearning.com and Gizmos for Science)
- STAAR-EOC Support Materials Outline for additional EOC support in a face-to-face and virtual learning environment
- STAAR-EOC Strategies and Considerations Outline for specific considerations required to support students preparing for the STAAR-EOC
- Customized asynchronous instructional pathways in Imagine Math for Algebra 1 retesters, with additional supports for students with disabilities and English Learners. Access to live tutors is an embedded option for any student who continues to struggle with Algebra 1.

Additionally, Secondary Curriculum continues to provide staff development to address targeted areas of student need. These include:

- Job-Embedded Professional Development in all Content Areas Content Specific Teacher Development Specialist
- Staff Development Trainings with a focus on Planning for EOC Review
- Achieve 180 Wednesdays Professional Development Trainings
- Professional Development Opportunities for District/Campus Leaders and Teachers with a Focus on the Planning for Instruction with Mastery in Mind tool to address tier one instruction and differentiation (i.e., Special Populations)
- Literacy Offerings during monthly Principals' Meetings
- Content Area Department Chairperson Meetings
- Focused Professional Development Opportunities for Teacher Development Specialists on Specially Designed Instruction and Universal Design for Learning to address tier one instruction and differentiation (i.e., Special Education)
- Targeted staff development training for teachers in the implementation of Imagine Math for Algebra 1 retesters in addition to special data monitoring of Algebra 1 retesters.

The Office of Special Education Services (OSES) continues to review efforts and to refine development opportunities, resources and support, in collaboration with other Special Populations teams and Curriculum to support campus leaders, teachers, and other campus staff to ensure student progress and achievement on End of Course (EOC) assessments. We have made concerted efforts to form strategic partnerships with members of other Special Populations teams, Elementary and Secondary Curriculum, as well as campuses to determine shared communication, trainings, and on-going support to teachers. In addition, we want to ensure the consistency in messaging and efforts, while learning together to support campuses and ensure student success on EOCs.

The Office of Special Education Services will continue to provide support and guidance to campuses to address the specific needs of students with disabilities by doing the following:

- Offer more training for Specially Designed Instruction and the Power of Two (Co-Teach)
- Provide content-embedded training with the use of Goalbook Instructional Strategies
- Offer more training and support for the effective use of accessibility features and designated supports for students with disabilities who are enrolled in EOC courses based on their documented needs in the IEP
- Program Specialists will work with campus teams (department chairs, case managers, teachers, etc.) to ensure students with disabilities are provided with the appropriate designated supports that are specific to their needs and deficits
- Ensure that designated supports are routinely used during instruction and assessment for students with disabilities who are enrolled in EOC courses based on their documented needs in the IEP
- Collaborate with Secondary Curriculum Department on embedding instructional strategies to support SWDs in all content areas instruction including EOC courses
- Support district literacy initiative, Literacy Empowered for high school campuses
- Increase our level of instructional coaching and support to campuses
- Continue to support reading proficiency by providing SDI specifically related to dyslexia strategies
- Through ongoing discussions with Campus Leaders and continued professional development in the areas of Least Restrictive Environment and Continuum of Educational Placement, there is additional emphasis on ensuring students are access the general curriculum to the maximum extent possible.

To continue momentum of our efforts, the Office of Special Education Services (OSES) will continue to collaborate with cross-functional teams and Curriculum to provide meaningful professional development for general and special education teachers: especially in the areas of designated supports and high-quality instruction, including co-teaching.

- OSES will promote access to instructional professional development for special education teachers, including literacy training
- OSES will continue to train Department Chairs, SPED Program Specialists, TIER I and TIER
 II Leaders on improving special education instructional strategies for students with
 disabilities accessing the general education curriculum
- OSES will continue to engage in dialogue with campus leadership teams to integrate special education teachers into data-driven PLCs to unpack standards and student expectations that will drive targeted intervention based on student needs using OnTrack and lead4ward reports

 OSES will collaborate with Student Assessment, Interventions, and the Secondary Curriculum Department to develop training for teachers on the Accelerated Instruction Plan for students with disabilities who will need to retake STAAR EOCs


