The Black Knights walked into Fall Classic as defending champs from last spring's Blue Bonnet district drill meet. Nothing has changed except for the fact they are even better than they were last spring. The unarmed drill team and both color guard teams have elevated their performances from being middle of the pack to now on top of the district. The armed drill team remained steady winning their third 1st Place trophy in the last three district meets.

The cadets enjoyed a rigorous competition and that matters!






