SUBJECT: **STUDENT DISCIPLINARY ACTION REPORT, 2021–2022**

Attached is the Student Disciplinary Action Report for 2021–2022. The report is organized according to the coding categories used by the Texas Education Agency (TEA) and includes the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal disciplinary incidents that occurred on each campus.

Key findings include:

- In 2020–2021, disciplinary action rates were low due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2021–2022, the number of in-school suspensions increased but not to the levels from 2018–2019 or 2019–2020. The number of out-of-school suspensions exceeded the number from 2019–2020 but did not reach the number from 2018–2019.
- In 2021–2022, there were 1,999 referrals to disciplinary alternative education programs (DAEP) and 43 expulsions to juvenile justice alternative education programs (JJAEP), similar to pre-pandemic levels.
- In 2021–2022, students who are male, Black, receive special education services, economically disadvantaged, or considered at risk received disciplinary actions at a disproportionately higher rate.
- In 2021–2022 for students in prekindergarten (PK) through 2nd grade, the number of total in-school suspensions was 14 and the number of total out-of-school suspensions was five.
- In 2021–2022, 9th grade students had the largest proportion of in-school suspensions, out-of-school suspensions, referrals to DAEP, and expulsions to JJAEP compared to all other grade levels.
- In 2021–2022, among the race/ethnicity groups, Black students have the highest percentage of missed days of school due to out-of-school-suspensions. Male students, students in special education, students at risk, and economically disadvantaged students also have a rate higher than the district's rate.
- According to chapter 37 of the TEC, out-of-school suspensions are not to be given to homeless students for a discretionary discipline action reason. However, in 2021–2022, homeless students missed a total of 727 days due to out-of-school suspensions for a discretionary reason.
- In 2021–2022, 206 students in special education were removed from their regular instructional settings for more than ten days due to in-school or out-of-school suspensions.
- Students who missed more days of school due to out-of-school suspensions tend to have lower promotion rates to the next grade level.

Administrative Response

The Social and Emotional Learning Department (SEL) and the Schools Office are committed to reducing the impact of exclusionary disciplinary practices on our students.

The SEL Department focuses on building the capacity of administrators and teachers to shape and sustain campus-wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), Culturally Responsive Teaching, Restorative Discipline Practices, and SEL curriculum to increase equity in the district, decrease exclusionary discipline-related practices, and offer alternatives to suspension.

In 2021-2022, the following was accomplished:

- Continued to expand the Education First Substance Abuse model, which in lieu of DAEP placement provides an educational and therapeutic opportunity for students by including substance abuse clinicians in partnership with Teen and Family Services, who work directly with students who have had a first-time drug-related offense on the campus.
- Completed phase two of the implementation of the new SEL online curriculum platform which provides a framework for mental health, wellness instruction and knowledge, and includes teacher component and K-12 student.
- SEL and Schools Offices collaborated to ensure that secondary campuses provided the Sandy Hook training. The Sandy Hook Promise initiative, which equips students with an anonymous reporting tool to prevent self-harm, harm to others, and bullying.
- Increased support for Alternatives to Suspension initiatives that focused on supporting students with social-emotional learning skills, restorative practices, mentoring, and other alternatives to suspension while ensuring that each student remains on track to graduate.

Areas of Focus for 2022-2023

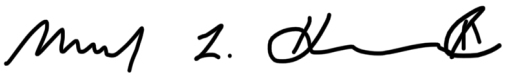
- Increase in need for data compliance and a tracking system to ensure all data is accurate.
- Special Education Department is hosting discipline review meetings at all high school campuses in the spring of 2023.
- Schools Office
 - The discipline data will be shared with principals and the following will be determined:
 - Implications of the data
 - Factors contributing to the data
 - Systems and support needed to improve discipline data monitoring
 - School Support Officers (SSOs) will follow-up and provide support to principals with high percentages of data disparities, which will include planning and monitoring discipline data frequently
 - The Schools Office and Federal and State Compliance Teams will conduct quarterly data analysis to review to ensure campuses don't have data disparities

SEL and Schools Office continue to work on decreasing Student Code of Conduct violations, exclusionary disciplinary practices such as suspensions and referrals to the DAEP, and racial disproportionality in disciplinary actions by providing districtwide professional development and support that primarily focuses on whole-student social and emotional development.

Our district goal is to increase understanding and knowledge of students' rights and responsibilities and to decrease the use of exclusionary consequences. The SEL Department hosts professional development training for all Campus Discipline Coordinators and other administrators involved with student discipline management. The training includes the following topics: understanding school systems that encourage the development of positive staff/student relationships; positive behavioral techniques; an understanding of the HISD Code of Student Conduct; and the referral process and procedures for placement in the Discipline Alternative Education Program (DAEP) and the Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Program (JJAEP). Participants also gain knowledge of revisions to the Texas Education Code Chapter 37 and HISD Board Policy.

In addition, all referrals to the Discipline Education Programs are centrally processed to ensure that students' rights to due process are safeguarded, alternatives have been considered by campus administrators, and that campus disciplinary practices are aligned with the HISD Student Code of Conduct.

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Student Disciplinary Action Report 2021–2022

Executive Summary

Program Description

This report summarizes the disciplinary action reasons and codes for the 2021–2022 school year and was produced in compliance with Texas Education Code (TEC) Chapter 39. It is organized according to the coding categories used by the Texas Education Agency (TEA) and includes a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal disciplinary incidents that occurred on each campus.

Highlights

- In 2020–2021, disciplinary action rates were low due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2021–2022, the number of in-school suspensions increased but not to the levels from 2018–2019 or 2019–2020. The number of out-of-school suspensions exceeded the number from 2019–2020 but did not reach the number from 2018–2019.
- In 2021–2022, there were 1,999 referrals to disciplinary alternative education programs (DAEP) and 43 expulsions to juvenile justice alternative education programs (JJAEP), similar to pre-pandemic levels.
- In 2021–2022, students who were male, Black, receive special education services, economically disadvantaged, or considered at risk received disciplinary actions at disproportionately higher rates. Black students were more than twice as likely than their peers to receive a disciplinary action.
- In 2021–2022 for students in prekindergarten (PK) through 2nd grade, the number of total in-school suspensions was 14 and the number of total out-of-school suspensions was five.
- In 2021–2022, 9th grade students had the largest proportion of in-school suspensions (37.2 percent), out-of-school suspensions (21.8 percent), referrals to DAEP (32.5 percent), and expulsions to JJAEP (30.2 percent).
- In 2021–2022, among the race/ethnicity groups, Black students have the highest percentage of missed days of school due to out-of-school-suspensions. Male students, students in special education, students at risk, and economically disadvantaged students also have a rate higher than the district's rate.
- According to chapter 37 of the TEC, out-of-school suspensions are not to be given to homeless students for a discretionary discipline action reason. However, in 2021–2022, homeless students missed a total of 727 days due to out-of-school suspensions for a discretionary reason.
- In 2021–2022, 206 students in special education were removed from their regular instructional settings for more than ten days due to in-school or out-of-school suspensions.
- Students who missed more days of school due to out-of-school suspensions tend to have lower promotion rates to the next grade level.

Introduction

Methods

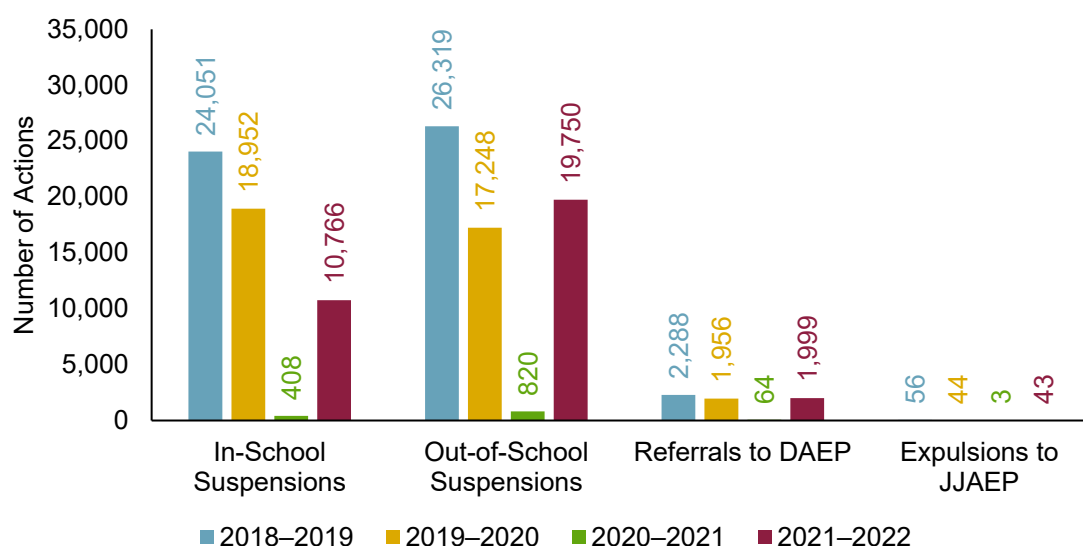
Discipline data were taken from the 2021–2022 PEIMS Summer Resubmission file, and enrollment and demographic data were taken from the 2021–2022 PEIMS Fall Snapshot file. In the report, duplicate counts of actions refer to the total number of incidents, not the total number of students. Unduplicated counts indicate the number of students that committed a particular offense.

Results

Counts of Disciplinary Actions

Figure 1 shows the duplicated number of disciplinary actions for the past four years. The number of disciplinary actions in 2020–2021 were low due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tables 1–4 (pp. 3–6) show the enrollment, number and proportion of unduplicated disciplinary actions, and number and proportion of duplicated disciplinary actions by gender, race/ethnicity, and other demographic groups. Compared to enrollment proportions, students who are male, Black, receive special education services, economically disadvantaged, or considered at risk continue to receive disciplinary actions at disproportionately higher rates.

- In 2021–2022, 50.5 percent of HISD's students were male, but out of the 6,505 students who received in-school suspensions, 58.2 percent were male.
- In 2021–2022, 22.2 percent of HISD's students were Black, but out of the 6,505 students who received in-school suspensions, 33.1 percent were Black.
- In 2021–2022, 8.4 percent of HISD's students received special education services, but out of the 6,505 students who received in-school suspensions, 11.0 percent were in special education.
- In 2021–2022, 79.2 percent of HISD's students were economically disadvantaged, but out of the 6,505 students who received in-school suspensions, 87.6 percent were economically disadvantaged.
- In 2021–2022, 61.5 percent of HISD's students were considered at risk, but out of the 6,505 students who received in-school suspensions, 80.7 percent were considered at risk.

- In 2021–2022, 50.5 percent of HISD's students were male, but out of the 10,554 students who received out-of-school suspensions, 57.3 percent were male.
- In 2021–2022, 22.2 percent of HISD's students were Black, but out of the 10,554 students who received out-of-school suspensions, 41.6 percent were Black.
- In 2021–2022, 8.4 percent of HISD's students received special education services, but out of the 10,554 students who received out-of-school suspensions, 13.8 percent were in special education.
- In 2021–2022, 79.2 percent of HISD's students were economically disadvantaged, but out of the 10,554 students who received out-of-school suspensions, 86.2 percent were economically disadvantaged.
- In 2021–2022, 61.5 percent of HISD's students were considered at risk, but out of the 10,554 students who received out-of-school suspensions, 77.0 percent were considered at risk.

- In 2021–2022, 8.4 percent of HISD's students received special education services, but out of the 1,692 students who received DAEP referrals, 15.7 percent were in special education.
- In 2021–2022, 79.2 percent of HISD's students were economically disadvantaged, but out of the 1,692 students who received DAEP referrals, 86.6 percent were economically disadvantaged.
- In 2021–2022, 61.5 percent of HISD's students were considered at risk, but out of the 1,692 students who received DAEP referrals, 82.2 percent were considered at risk.

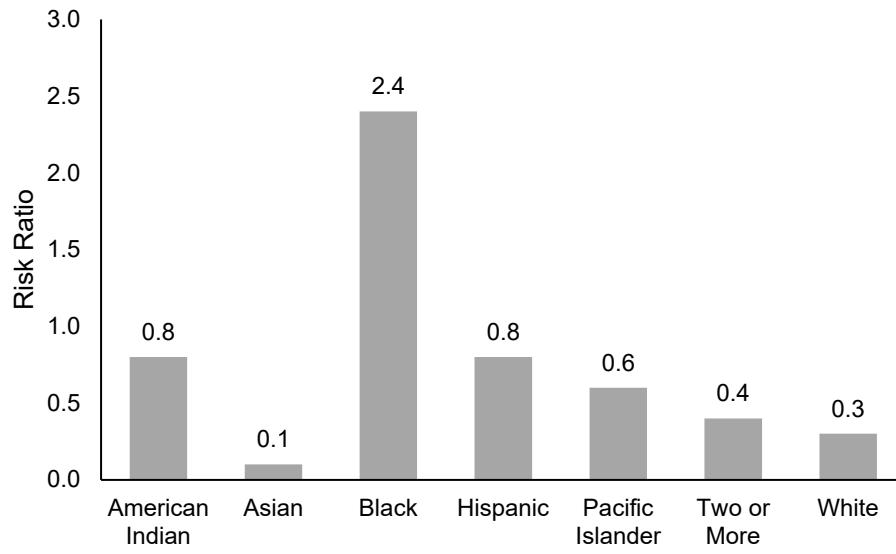

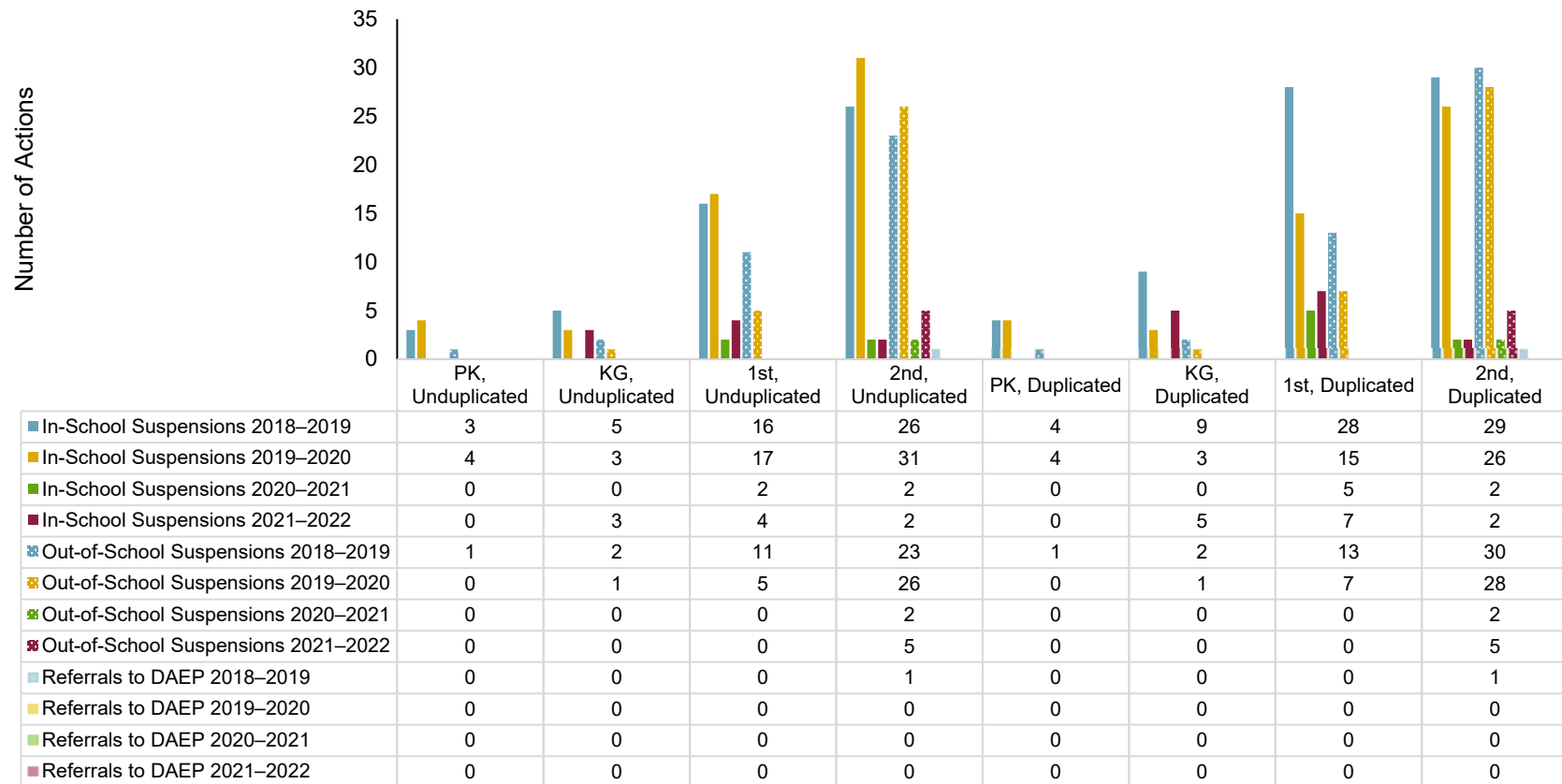
- In 2021–2022, 50.5 percent of HISD's students were male, but out of the 42 students who received JJAEP expulsions, 66.7 percent were male.
- In 2021–2022, 22.2 percent of HISD's students were Black, but out of the 42 students who received JJAEP expulsions, 31.0 percent were Black.
- In 2021–2022, 8.4 percent of HISD's students received special education services, but out of the 42 students who received JJAEP expulsions, 14.3 percent were in special education.

Another way to look at the disproportionality of disciplinary actions is by calculating the risk ratio, which is the percentage of disciplinary actions per student group divided by the percentage of disciplinary actions for all students not in that student group. **Figure 2** (p. 7) shows the risk ratios of total disciplinary actions for each race/ethnicity subgroup. A higher risk ratio indicates a higher rate of discipline. Black students are more than twice as likely as their peers to receive a disciplinary action.

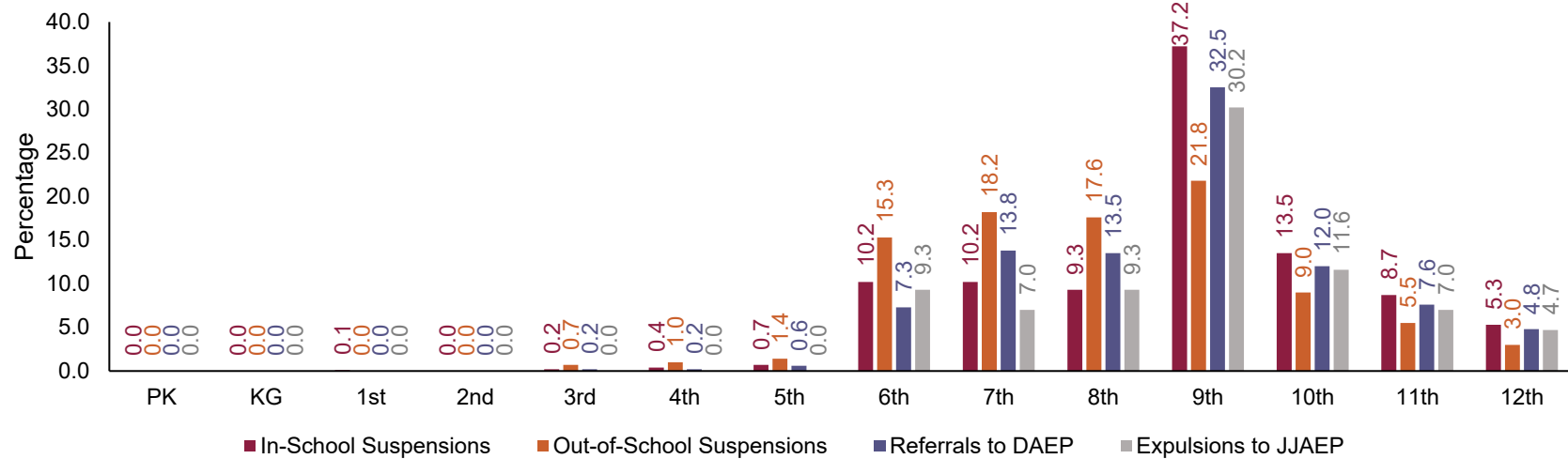
Figure 3 (p. 8) shows the unduplicated and duplicated counts of disciplinary actions for students in PK through 2nd grade. Per board policy FO(LOCAL), “Beginning with the 2016–17 school year, no student shall be informally sent home. No student prior to third grade shall be suspended, placed into a disciplinary alternative setting, or expelled, except as required by law.” Systems should be established to monitor, verify, and document that all PK through 2nd grade disciplinary actions taken were legally required.

- In 2021–2022, there were 14 in-school suspensions and five out-of-school suspensions among students in PK through 2nd grade.

Figure 4 (p. 9) shows the proportion of disciplinary actions across grade levels for 2021–2022, and **Table 5** (p. 9) shows the counts. Students in the 9th grade had the largest proportion of in-school suspensions (37.2 percent), out-of-school suspensions (21.8 percent), referrals to DAEP (32.5 percent), and expulsions to JJAEP (30.2 percent).

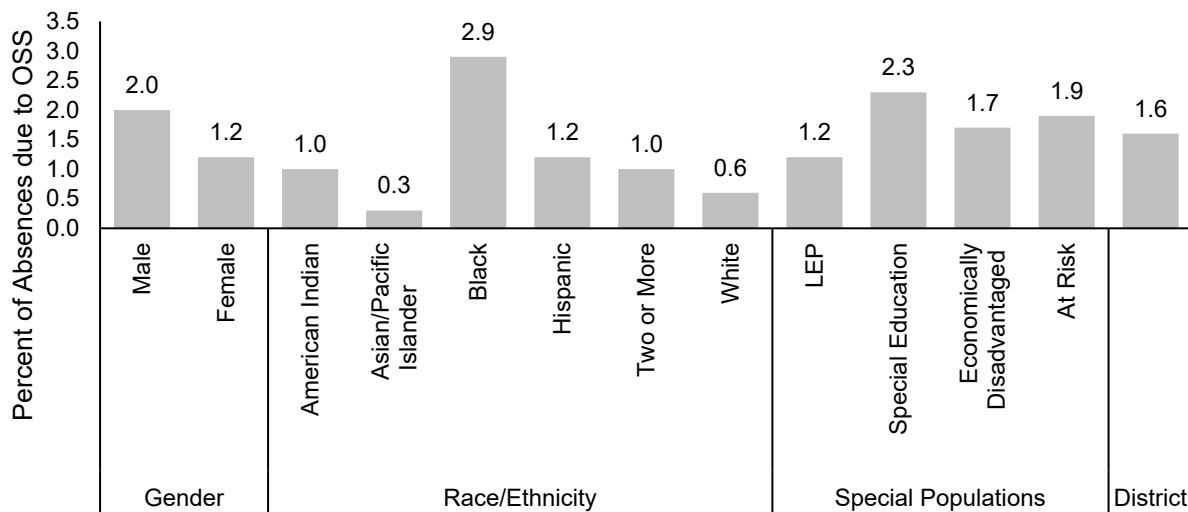

Missed Days of School

Figure 5 (p. 10) shows the percentage of missed days of school due to out-of-school suspensions out of the total number of absences by subgroup. Among the race/ethnicity groups, Black students have the highest percentage of missed days due to out-of-school-suspensions. Male students, students in special education, students at risk, and economically disadvantaged students also have a rate higher than the district's rate.

Figure 5. Percentage of Absences due to Out-of-School Suspensions by Subgroup, 2021–2022

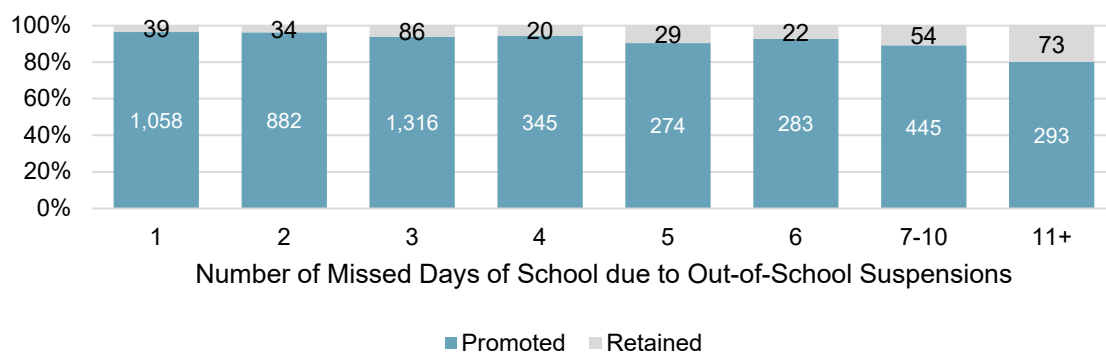

There are strict regulations regarding out-of-school suspensions for homeless students. Per Chapter 37 of the TEC, a school district may not place homeless students in out-of-school suspension for discretionary discipline action reason codes. However, in the 2021–2022 school year homeless students missed a total of 727 days of school due to discretionary discipline action reason codes.

There are also regulations pertaining to the amount of time students in special education are removed from their regular instructional settings. In 2021–2022, of the 1,762 students in special education who received an in-school or out-of-school suspension, 206 (11.7 percent) missed more than ten days of school due to the disciplinary action they received.

Promotion Rates

Figure 6 shows the promotion rates for students who missed a certain number of days of school due to out-of-school suspensions. Promotion rates are only calculated for students through grade 8. Students who missed more days of school tend to have lower promotion rates to the next grade level.

Discussion

In general, it seems that the numbers of disciplinary actions are decreasing from 2018–2019. In the 2021–2022 school year, the number of in-school suspensions is less than half compared to the number before the pandemic in 2018–2019. The number out-of-school suspensions is higher than the amount from 2019–2020 but still lower than the number from 2018–2019. The number of referrals to DAEP and expulsions to JJAEP are about the same from 2019–2020.

Students who are male, Black, receive special education services, economically disadvantaged, or considered at risk continue to receive disciplinary actions at a disproportionately higher rate than their peers. Black students, in particular, are more than twice as likely as their peers in receiving a disciplinary action. This trend should remain a focus for campuses as they seek to provide equitable learning environments for all students.

In 2021–2022, students in prekindergarten through 2nd grade received 14 in-school suspensions and five out-of-school suspensions, which is less than the numbers from 2018–2019. Disciplinary actions given to students below grade 3 should be scrutinized to ensure that they follow the proper guidelines.

In 2021–2022, homeless students missed 727 days of school due to out-of-school suspensions given for discretionary reasons, which should not be the case according to the TEC. Students in special education also should not be removed from their regular instructional settings for more than ten days, but in 2021–2022, 206 of them missed more than ten days of school due to an in-school or out-of-school suspension. Schools must investigate the circumstances around these suspensions and resolve not to repeat the same actions in the future.

Overall, 1.6 percent of the district's absences in 2021–2022 were due to out-of-school suspensions. However, the percentage was higher for Black students (2.9 percent), students in special education (2.3 percent), male students (2.0 percent), students considered at risk (1.9 percent), and economically disadvantaged students (1.7 percent). Because missing days from school correlates to lower promotion rates and less school funding, schools must exercise wisdom and discernment on when and how often to suspend, refer, or expel students.
