HISD Promotion Retention Summer Program is for students in grades 1-2 who are enrolled as of the last day of school in an HISD school and need to meet the promotion standards. The extended time offered by summer programs provide students with additional opportunities filled with rigorous and relevant accelerated instruction and reinforcement to achieve the school year's final expected outcomes. It is the goal of HISD that



through effective summer programs, all students who need this extended time will meet the required promotion standards, be prepared for success at the next grade level, and be on-track to graduate with their peers.

PROMOTION STANDARDS 2024-2025

For HISD students to be promoted to the next grade level, they must show that they have met HISD's Promotion Standards. These standards include classroom grades, local or state tests, and attendance as follows:

• State requirement of overall yearly grade average of 70 or above and local requirement of a grade average of 70 or above in language arts, mathematics, and science and/or social studies.



 Sufficient attendance – a student's total number of absences cannot exceed 10 percent of class meetings.



Phase 2 Pre-K Application Opens	April 1. 2025	
Families may begin to upload eligibility documents		
Last Day for families to accept lottery offers	April 17, 2025	
Phase 2 Pre-K Application Closes	May 5, 2025	
Families are notified of their child's lottery results (Tuition PK4 & PK3)	May 16, 2025	
Families must accept their child's placement	5 days after offer



Reclassification And Exit

In order for your child to be reclassified, or be considered English proficient, they will need to take and pass the required tests based on their grade level.

Texas English Learner Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS)

• Tests the student's English language proficiency for Kindergarten through 12th grade.

State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR)

• Tests the student's academic knowledge of English for 3rd through 8th grade.

End of Course (EOC)

• Tests the student's academic knowledge of English for 9th and 10th grade.

Iowa Assessments, Form F

• Tests students showing high levels of English proficiency in the area of English academic achievement in grades 1-2 and 11-12.
