

REOPENING TIMELINE FALL 2020

Starting on August 24, parents will receive a phone call from the district, asking them to indicate their choice for the 2020-2021 school year. Parents will be asked to select one of the following options:

- Option 1: On-Campus Learning
- Option 2: Virtual Learning

After each six-week grading period, parents may change their selection.

DON'T FORGET TO COMPLETE SOCIOECONOMIC FORM FOR 2020-21 SCHOOL YEAR



The Houston Independent School District will provide free breakfast and lunch to students for the 2020-2021 school year, but parents will still need to

fill out a new socioeconomic form.

Because all HISD students qualify for free breakfast and lunch parents will not need to complete and return a free and reduced-price meal application. However, HISD is still required to collect and report the socioeconomic status of each student via a blue form that is then sent to the Texas Education Agency. This ensures campuses receive Title I funding.

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Parents must complete and return one form to each school where they have a child enrolled. A form is not needed for pre-K students who have been qualified based on proof of income eligibility or homeless status.

It is very important that families complete the form so that schools can receive Title I and State Compensatory Education funding, which directly impact campuses and students throughout the district. Title I and State Compensatory Education funding can be used to:

- Hire personnel
- Provide tutoring services
- Order technology
- Provide professional development for teachers.

Socioeconomic forms are also utilized in the annual state accountability ratings, ensuring that each campus is compared to other campuses with the same percentage of economically disadvantaged students.

Forms will be made available electronically, and every HISD campus will have paper copies available. All parents should complete and return the form by Friday, Oct. 16. The Public Education Information Management System encompasses all data requested and received by TEA about public education, including student demographic and academic performance, personnel, financial, and organizational information.

HISD LAUNCHES 'LET'S STAY CONNECTED' MENTAL HEALTH HOTLINE FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

The Houston Independent School District has announced the launch of Let's Stay Connected, a mental health hotline for students and parents to provide emotional, social, and psychological support to students and parents who feel the need for assistance.

Students and parents may call the Let's Stay Connected Hotline at 713-556-1340 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Trained staff from HISD's Social and Emotional Learning Department are available to offer counseling, mental health education, and make referrals in English and Spanish.

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"One of the consequences of the COVID-19 crisis we have seen is an increase in the need for mental health support among our students and parents," Interim Superintendent Grenita Lathan said. "May is Mental Health Awareness Month so what better time to launch our hotline to address families' needs in a way that is easily accessible and at no cost to them."

Callers to the hotline may remain anonymous.

All HISD staff members are reminded they have access to the Employee Assistance Program (EAP), which may be reached by calling 833-812-5181 and is offered at no cost to employees.

CAMP SPARK

We are inviting all our Rice School students to participate in HISD's **Camp Spark** which will be held Aug. 24 through Sept. 4, and is free of charge for all HISD students in pre-K through 12th grade.

The HISD Academics Department is hosting this virtual interactive Academic Enrichment Camp designed to provide students with enrichment leading up to the first day of the 2020-21 school year while reinforcing academic skills.

Students will participate in interactive engaging activities in science, math, literacy, technology, and art.

Elementary:

- Virtual field trips
- Interactive literacy, math, science, and technology activities

Secondary:

- Interactive activities on navigating the HUB, Microsoft, and Google
- SAT prep, college admissions, financial aid, and scholarship preparation

As part of Camp Spark, the academics team has also created the "Attend to Win" program. Students who participate daily will have the chance to win gift cards and a Bluetooth Boombox.
