P NWEA MAP Testing: HISD has begun using the NWEA MAP assessment to measure student growth in Algebra I, English I, English II and Biology courses. Students will take this exam three times this year (beginning of the year, middle of the year, and end of the year). Students will take the exam for the first time between Sept. 18th and Sept. 29th. Please ensure your student comes to school during this window with a charged laptop to make their testing

P PSAT Testing: HAIS will offer the PSAT 8/9, the PSAT 10, and the PSAT/NMSQT exams on October 11th for all 9th-11th grade students. The exams will be digital so students must bring their device to school that day. The PSAT exams are tests that align to the college admissions SAT exam. They follow a similar format, and they provide scores that help predict students' SAT scores and give insights into how students can improve. For 11th graders, the PSAT/NMSQT is a qualifying exam for the National Merit Scholarship competition. Students with excellent scores from around the country can become finalists as seniors and earn great merit scholarships, but must qualify with a high score on the PSAT. 10th and 11th graders can also use their scores for TSI completion if they meet the benchmarks. 10th and 11th grade students are practicing the test format in their AVID courses, and any student who wishes to do additional study can check out Khan Academy for personalized recommendations and practice based on their previous PSAT scores

KENNEDY LUGAR YOUTH EXCHANGE AND STUDY (YES) ABROAD

A program of the U.S. Department of State, the YES Abroad program provides scholarships for eligible American high school students and recent graduates to live with host families and attend a local high school for an academic year in countries like Egypt, Ghana, India, Senegal, Thailand, Turkey and more. YES Abroad students promote mutual understanding between the U.S. and the host country by building relationships with the local community. NATIONAL SECURITY LANGUAGE INITIATIVE FOR YOUTH (NSLI-Y)

A program of the U.S. Department of State, the NSLI-Y program provides scholarships for eligible American high school students and recent graduates to learn one of eight critical languages: Persian, Indonesian, Hindi, Turkish, Chinese (Mandarin), Russian, Korean, and Arabic! Summer and academic year programs are available, with all programs including language instruction, cultural lessons and activities, conversation practice with local peers, and a host family component. 
