Additionally, students still on campus at 4:30pm will be asked to wait at the Spark Park for their ride.


We ask that students waiting for pick up to not leave the campus grounds and return.



NURSE'S STATION

NEED GLASSES?

See to Succeed is a program offered by the City of Houston Health Dept. to provide comprehensive eye exams and glasses at no cost to students up to age 18. It is a school based program. Signed consent forms are due **Monday**, **October 10th**.

Please see Nurse Shioura in the clinic or Mr. Estrada in Room 110 for consent forms.



Does your child currently wear glasses? Are they having trouble seeing? Do they have broken glasses? Have they attended See to Succeed in the past?

If you answered **YES** to any of the questions listed above, please contact your school nurse to participate in See to Succeed.

See to Succeed is a program offered by the City of Houston Health Department to provide **FREE** eye exams and glasses to students in need ages 6 to 18 years old. See to Succeed is a school-based program where the students are picked up at the school and bused to the West End Health Center for a multi-station structured eye exam serving 100 students daily. Glasses are then delivered to the school Nurse about 4 to 6 weeks after their event date and distributed to the students.

HCC INFORMATION

HCC FERPA FORMS

HCC FERPA Forms allow professors and parents to communicate once and only if students turn completed forms.

The first form is the notary form. This form is used when students are unable to be in person at the HCC Campus Registration Office. Once complete, students submit the form to HCC. Students/parents should submit the completed Notary form to their Grade Level Dean.


