Michelle Sacks called the meeting to order. A motion to approve the September 1<sup>st</sup> minutes made by Kim Lopez and seconded by Cara Grossman.

Members introduced themselves.

School Safety Update postponed to later in the meeting.

**Social Media Update:** Jenny Moreno reported no updates. She encouraged members to share relevant information and photos to post.

**Nutrition Service Update:** Nan Cramer reported that the salad bars will return to the elementary schools in November. A farmers' market will be held at the Hattie Mae White administration building on December 2<sup>nd</sup>. Dietitians are attending the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics annual conference in Orlando. Betti Wiggins will be receiving an honorary membership to the Academy. Dietitian, Nathan, and Chef Brittany presented at the Health and Physical Education Professional Development session on Tuesday. Betti Wiggins attended the White House Conference on Nutrition and Hunger last week.

**Health and Medical Services Update:** Chantee Hale reported that the department is working to get COVID testing operating in schools. The testing has not yet begun.

**Family and Community Engagement Update:** No representative was in attendance.

**Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) Update:** Bea Marquez reported SEL statistics – 193 campuses have SEL specialists, and they provided 670 hours of support. The crisis team has been out in schools to provide support for students and adults at the campuses. SEL is servicing 100 students at the reengagement center to help District Alternative Education Program (DAEP) students reintegrate back into their home schools. Students will be doing a self-assessment of SEL competencies such as good decision-making, self-awareness, etc. ReThink Ed will be facilitating the meeting which will address, SEL needs, and academic needs.

**Health and Physical Education (HPE) Update:** Francina Hollingsworth reported that HPE held a professional development session at Madison High School on Tuesday. The new textbook companies assisted teachers with navigating their virtual platforms. New sessions included Ultimate Frisbee and tennis. The yoga cohort members led a session on mindfulness. Felicia Ceaser-White is collaborating with the principal at Tijerina Elementary to implement a sensory/common room on campus. Funds from the CDC will help furnish the room. HPE staff are continuing to conduct site visits to provide feedback and support.

**HPD Officer Treva Mott provided a safety update.** Youth programs like Teen and Police Service Academy (TAPS) helps students interact safely with police and it provides 1 high school credit hour. The Police Advisory League (PAL) work alongside HISD Police and they hold athletic events and provide services such as medical and dental screenings. Youth Police Advisory Council (Y-PAC) are students looking for leadership opportunities and do community service projects.

Michelle Sacks shared that October is domestic violence awareness month. She shared statistics of a publication from the Texas Council on Family Violence called Honoring Texas Victims. 204 Texans were killed by intimate partners in 2021.

Michelle introduced her colleagues, Alyssa Rodriguez, and Bola Ositelu from the Houston Area Woman's Center. Alyssa reported that she visits Edison Middle School every Thursday talking to students about safety, bullying, consent, online safety, etc. Bola will be working in the eastside, Magnolia Park area to teach young people and build leadership skills.

Angela Rubio gave an update on Wraparound Services. The department has realigned with the school offices so that they can better support the Superintendent's strategic plan. They have been meeting with principals and proposing campus support plans. Their effort is to be more visible to the families and support all students not just the ones we think need support.

Michelle also reported an upcoming educational roundtable on Human Trafficking that will be held at the United Way in December. She will share the flier when it is available.
