Academics:

Enrollment Updates: As of Thursday, April 20, 2022, we have a total of 95 committed enrolling into Jones Futures Academy. 15 PTECH, 44 Health Science and 36 Architecture. Continued recruitment efforts include campus visits, calls to parents pending submitting application, promotional materials were mailed to all neighboring middle schools.

CCMR indicators: Of the 66 graduating seniors we have a total of 23 student who are yet to satisfy a CCMR. To support with college, career, military readiness we are hosting a series of study labs that focus on OSHA certifications and/or TSIA prep days with intervention teachers on campus. Tutorials will continue the month of April 2022 leading up to state assessments. During the meeting Gongati committed to support with TSIA prep during his planning times if necessary.

Behavior:

Partnership with TEACH (to educate all children) The referrals have minimized as the teachers are including strategies to de-escalate behavior concerns. The principal debriefs with the campus counselor or the SpEd coordinator to bring forward look for or adjustments to better serve the student needs.
