Role of SDMC

- An SDMC shall be established at each school to:
 - Assist the Principal
 - Advise the Principal
 - The SDMC is exclusively an advisory role
 - Approve staff development of a campus nature
 - The principal has the final authority in fiduciary and financial decisions. The principal will be held accountable for compliance with all laws, regulations, policies, and procedures.

Responsibilities of SDMC

- History: The Houston Independent School District Board of Education established and approved the campus-level planning and decision-making process in 1992. The process includes the creation and maintenance of a Shared Decision-Making Committee (SDMC) at each school to review goals, objectives, and programs.
- Reviewing and making recommendations regarding the school's organizational structure

- Establishing procedures to periodically obtain broad based community, parent, and staff input

Identify Co-Chairperson

This person is selected from School Based Professional. We have one member who meets this criterion. Nominations for Co-Chairperson of SDMC.

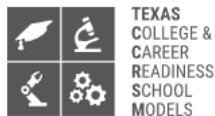
PTECH Designation

PTECH Designation at Jones Futures Academy is open enrollment that allow students least likely to attend college an opportunity to receive both a high school diploma, an associate degree in Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning with Houston Community College.

PTECH Blueprint

- Enroll Historically underserved students, targeting at-risk and economically disadvantaged
- Provide dual credit at no cost to students
- Offer rigorous instruction and accelerated courses
- Provide academic and social support services to help students succeed
- Provide students with highly personalized attention
- Increase college readiness
- Partner with Texas institutions of higher education (IHEs) to reduce barriers to college access

The Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH) Blueprint provides foundational principles and standards for innovative partnerships with business and industry and colleges and universities. The Texas Education Agency (TEA) provides technical assistance to promote implementation of the P-TECH model with fidelity. To support in the efforts a PTECH Grant Administrator is assigned as on campus support in addition to a mentor coach from Texas College and Career Readiness School Model, D. Del Pilar.



The Blueprint contains six benchmarks outlining the design elements that each PTECH campus must implement before serving students. Additionally, outcome-based measures in Access, Attainment, and Achievement provide guidance for the program implementation and continuous improvement efforts. The six benchmarks include:
