JROTC PROGRAM ACCREDITATION



Annually, HISD and or Cadet Command conducts a thorough inspection of each high school JROTC program to ensure quality assurance and control. The higher command inspects primarily by questioning cadets and examining their Cadet Portfolios.



In December, the office of the Director of Army Instruction (DAI) inspected the logistical operations of the Black Knights as the first portion of the Accreditation. Captain (Ret) Chapman inspected Cadet Krystal Ramirez to verify that her operations were in line with Cadet Command policies and procedures. Her assistant, Cadet Sergeant Elizabeth Rigney, was on hand to assist in the inspection.

CPT Chapman examined the clothing room, arms room, and storage room and he was pleased with what he found. SGT Ramirez earned an excellent rating from the DAI's office, and she is only a sophomore. She conducted herself as a young professional and was able to explain her role and responsibilities to the battalion perfectly.





The JPA inspection requires the entire staff to make sure the program is following guidelines. Cadet Captain Arianna Saenz, senior, leads the staff in the out brief to CPT Chapman following his inspection. CPT Chapman gave a few pointers that will help the logistics operations grow which helps the battalion excel at its mission which is helping young people become better citizens.


