## What We Are Learning

**Reading: Unit 6 – Native Americans: Tradition, Heritage, and the Land**

Students are introduced to the broad concept that indigenous people lived on the continents of North and South America long before European explorers arrived. Students explore the distinctive cultures of three Native American groups, and understand that each tribe had its own way of eating, dressing, and living, depending on where they lived. Students will understand how conditions in different geographical regions influenced the tribes' cultures, traditions, and way of life.

**Math: Module 3 – Comparison of Length, Weight, Capacity, and Numbers to 10**

E. Are There Enough?  
F. Comparison of Sets Within 10  
G. Comparison of Numerals

**Social Studies: Unit 3 – Everybody Works**

This unit aims to help students understand the difference between needs and wants, recognize various jobs and their importance, and explore the role of technology in meeting basic needs and improving daily life. Students will also develop problem-solving and decision-making skills.

**Science: Topic: Plants**

In this topic, students learn about plant needs and plant parts.

**Topic: Animals**

In this topic, students learn about animal needs and animal parts.

**SOR: Unit 6**

Students automatize the letter-sound correspondences and blending procedures they have learned so far. They are introduced to consonant clusters, letter names, rhyming words, and reading text independently.
