Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

Welcome to Lanier M.S. and a wonderful year of learning for your child. During this academic year your child/children will encounter a vast array of experiences to enhance their educational growth and well-being. Here at Lanier MS, they will be nurtured and cared for to ensure that their individual needs are met and considered.

During the 2020-2021 school year, your child's science class will open pathways to explore their world in different perspectives. Students will learn to become analytical thinkers as well as critical thinkers and apply previous knowledge to solve problems. They will also begin to enhance their skills of prediction to look in depth to future problems and ways to change unfavorable trends in the environment and their surroundings.

Course Objectives

- 1. Students will master basic chemistry concepts including the general properties and classifications of matter, atomic structure, the periodic table, atomic interactions in bonding, and chemical reactions.
- 2. Students will master basic physics concepts including motion, force, heat and energy, electricity and electromagnetism, waves, sound, and light.
- 3. Students will master basic Earth/space science concepts including plate tectonics, weathering and erosion, the energy of weather and climate, the solar system and the universe.
- 4. Students will gain a deeper understanding of the applications of chemistry, physics, and technology in everyday life.
- 5. Students will become more fluent in the scientific process.

Corrections Policy

- The Science Department has a policy that students may complete corrections for Homework, Class Work, and Quizzes if they made below a 70 on the original assignment.

- Students can earn up to a 70 for completing corrections, but they MUST follow ALL instructions for completing corrections to earn credit.

- Students may complete a re-test for any graded test if they earn below a 70 on the test.
- The re-test will be over the same objectives (TEKS), but it will have different questions.
