3. Distinguished Teacher Review (DTR) Rubric Draft February 2025- (Handout reviewed)

This process is within the Teacher Excellence System (TES) recognizes exceptional educators. Teachers who overall effectiveness level is Proficient II or higher are considered Distinguished Teacher. A teacher must apply for this review.

There are four Domains, and a teacher may receive up to 20 points. The Domains are as followed:

- Leadership- A Distinguished serve as a role model and leaders for peers across the campus.
- Lifelong Learning- A Distinguished Teacher initiates or seek out multiple learning opportunities.
- Contributions to the Profession- A Distinguished teacher contributes to the improvement of instructional practice of other teachers and/or impacts education policy at the campus, district, state or national level.
- Student Impact- Student surveys are used to identify strengths and areas for improvement related to teacher effectiveness.

4. Pre-K Enrollment

Importance: Students who attend Pre-K are lightly to make more academic gains that those who doesn't attends.
