Principal's Corner



The State funds schools based on average daily attendance, not based on enrollment. So, what does that mean? Lamar has more than 3100 students enrolled which would result in base funding of approximately \$11,470,000. When average daily attendance is factored in, we lose a significant amount of funding. See below for the last few years of average daily attendance and the approximate loss of base funding.

School Year	Average Daily Attendance Rate	Approximate Loss of Base Funding
2022-23	Current YTD 93.49%	\$746,697
2021-22	92,93%	\$810,929
2020-21	97.33%	\$306,249
2019-20	96.45%	\$407,185
2018-19	94.49%	\$631,997
2017-18	94.23%	\$661,819

Note: Average Daily Attendance is based on actual attendance and does not take into account whether the absence is excused or unexcused. Please also note that school funding is far more complex than the illustration above.

I have studied the average daily attendance trends and have a few general thoughts:

- Average Daily Attendance just over 94% was a stable number for us before we moved into our new neighborhood model.
- Average Daily Attendance improved by 2% when we moved into our new building and neighborhood model before going home for the pandemic.
- We hit an all-time high during the 2020-21 school year when we operated under the hybrid model allowing students to be on campus some and remote some of the time.
- Since returning to a more regular school schedule since the pandemic we have dropped to the lowest average daily attendance rate in our recent history.

 to anxiety and depression. This has resulted in needing more resources for families while at
 the same time reducing our funding across campus.

- We need to find a way to get back to our pre-pandemic attendance rates to give our students every opportunity for success.

Varsity Girls Golf





IB Annual Fee 2022-2023 Are Past Due

All 11th and 12th graders taking one or more IB classes are required to pay an <u>annual</u> \$90 IB fee. 11th and 12th grade IB course names end in SL and HL. If you see SL or HL on your child's schedule, your child is in an IB course.

This fee supports:

IB tests, IB materials, digital resources, and teacher trainings for our IB programs and if earned the **graduation stole.**


The actual fee that HISD pays to the IB is \$119 per course. When a student tests in five IB courses, HISD pays the IB \$595.

The annual fee of \$90 is past due.

Students who are identified as economically disadvantaged may pay \$30. You can make your annual payment through School Pay or in person at the Lamar business office.

Students must be 17 years old to donate with a signed parent permission slip (students who are 18 do not need a permission slip). Permission slips will be located at the Student Center (front desk in the Grand Hall) and the neighborhood clerks' desks.

To donate, students must have a form of identification on them (PowerSchool is acceptable). To prepare, students must wear a short-sleeve shirt, eat a hearty breakfast, and stay hydrated (snacks and drinks will be provided at the donation station). Students may NOT fast before their donation, participate in any athletic activity for at least 24 hours after donating, or wear a long-sleeve jacket or shirt. Students will be escorted to and back from the donation station at their allotted time by a STUCO member.

Donors can use this as a CAS experience for IBDP, 2 inside hours for NHS, and other applicable organizations (GT Independent Studies, Key Club, etc.).
