Shared Decision-Making Committee (SDMC)

Overview:

- SDMC assists the principal with developing, reviewing, and revising the campus improvement plan, specifically establishing academic and other performance objectives of the school for each academic excellence indicator adopted in the Texas Education Code (TEC).
- SDMC involved in planning, budgeting, curriculum, staffing patterns, staff development, and school organization.
- SDMC must approve portions of campus plan addressing campus staff development needs.
- The principal will consult the SDMC in matters relating to the school educational program, but the principal has the final authority in fiduciary and financial decisions.

Responsibilities:

- Implementing all pertinent campus-level planning processes
- Developing recommendations for the school budget
- Submitting recommendations for the school curriculum
- Recommending changes in the school's staffing patterns
- Developing and approving the campus staff development plans
- Developing, reviewing, and revising the School Improvement Plan (SIP) for the purpose of improving student performance for all student populations
- Present the SIP to the school-based professional staff for a vote of approval
- Reviewing and making recommendations regarding the school's organizational structure
- Establishing procedures to periodically obtain broad-based community, parent, and staff input
- Regularly communicating recommendations of SDMC to stakeholders

Requirements:

- Meetings must be held at least once per quarter, and at least one of which is a public meeting per year, after annual ratings are released in order to discuss campus objectives
 - Quarter 1-August, September, and October
 - Quarter 2-November, December, and January
 - Quarter 3–February, March, and April
 - Quarter 4–May, June, and July
- Post SDMC information on campus website including:
 - an up-to-date list of SDMC committee members
 - meeting dates
 - agendas
 - minutes
- A link to the SDMC page will be available on the school's home page

Assessment, Accountability, and Compliance

SDMC Composition

Membership **must include** parents, community representatives, and at least one business representative.

- Professional staff members must include at least two-thirds classroom teachers and onethird other campus-level professional staff. The number of classroom teachers should be at least twice the number of school-based professionals (2:1).
- at least two parents of students currently enrolled within the district selected by the campus's parent organization
- two community members (18+, not a parent or employee, district resident)
- one business representative (a person who operates a business without regard to location or residence)

The principal determines the size of the committee, and he/she has the authority to appoint additional parents, community representatives, and business representatives to the SDMC.

SDMC Elections

- Held in May
- Secret ballot to determine the school-based members
- Two-year staggered term
- Schools may identify first and second runner-ups that would fill vacancies during the first nine weeks of school only. When a vacancy occurs after that time period, an election is held by secret ballot to select a new representative to complete the term.
- Principal serves as chairperson, and a cochair is elected from professional staff.
