Check-In & General Updates (4:20 - 4:30)

• Staffing

- All teacher vacancies have been filled.
 - One applicant is still going through HR processing.
- EC: 2 full-time coteachers are on long-term leave
 - Currently paying for one additional full-time position to cover this.
 - EC coteachers will be working together to provide coverage for the other class.
 Coteacher lead has created a schedule.
- UE & UE: 4 classes without a coteacher
 - Contributing factor: 1 additional coteacher position is being used to cover Payne's former Lower Elementary class.
 - Parent volunteer undergoing Montessori training is currently supporting one of these classes.
 - We are offering positions to 3 recent applicants. We anticipate that all positions should be filled within the next 3 weeks (given typical HR processing turnaround).

POSSIP Feedback (4:30 - 4:45)

- Members reviewed responses to discuss glows and grows.
- Action steps:
 - Promote upcoming Possip feedback windows to increase participation
 - Increase communication for HR processing of new teacher hires
 - Continue filling coteacher vacancies

Campus Homework Policy (4:45 - 5:05)

- Committee reviewed **sample** homework policy from another campus.
- Committee discussed the possibility of there being more clarity about the minimum homework support (ex: reading at home, resources, high frequency word practice, etc). Bass will discuss with team leads and a draft will be provided to SDMC in the spring for final feedback before it is included in next year's school handbooks.

HOMEWORK

Purpose of Homework:

- Develop initiative, responsibility, and organizational skills.
- Extend learning and provide practice in applying concepts that teachers have presented in the classroom.
- Strengthen concept attainment and skill development. Research has shown that there
 are benefits for nightly practice of spelling words and math facts for brief periods,
 especially before bedtime when some studies show the brain repeats patterns and facts
 during sleep.
- Support reading outside of the regular school day which has shown to have many benefits for children.

HOMEWORK TIME ALLOTMENTS	
PK-1	Up to 20 minutes/night + independent reading
2-3	Up to 30 minutes/night + independent reading
4-5	Up to 50 minutes/night + independent reading
6-8	Up to 60 minutes/night + independent reading

*If a student has worked constructively for the suggested time frames, but the assignment is not complete or the child is frustrated, parents are encouraged to write a note to the teacher stating this to address his/her needs.

CAMPUS WIDE READING EXPECTATIONS

All students at AIMS are expected to read at home a minimum of 20 minutes a day.
