- I. Activity Calendar *revisit handbook to assure we're following up with established protocols* 
  - Space Reservations will only put on calendar when form submitted and approved.
  - Event Approval *limit during-instruction events/fundraisers*
  - Pep Rallies organize them to be before/after school and/or during lunch... streaming on projector in the Commons, holding it outside during lunch, etc.
  - Will have training for all coaches and club sponsors during August in-service days.
    - Coach Stewart requests 2 hours during in-service days to train coaches and necessary personnel with CPR.

### II. Homeroom

- Options for other time of day besides morning?
  - No feasible options during other parts of the day that would not cause more confusion or distractions – recommend to keep in the morning with revisit of tardy consequences.
    - If no SRC teacher, suggest to have once a week/month SRC in the auditorium for all noncompliant tardy students – take up phones and direct them to class quizzes on Canvas (if on Fridays) or to do Apex supplement work/tutorials that can be monitored for activity.
    - Suspend or further discipline consequences if not working in auditorium.
- Apex training next week during PLCs regarding Apex supplemental resources.

### III. Dress Code

- Do we keep the latest updates for start of next year? *Assure we put in writing what is allowable like sweatpants, flexible hoodie/jacket option, etc.*
- Emphasize that teachers are to send students to nearest office for dress code violations. Admin cannot capture all violators and we see many of them during lunch and afternoon in PJs, red shirts, etc.

### IV. Announcements

- Lunchtime projector for announcements
  - Who ought to take the lead? Student Council to organize and take lead.
    - 20-second video "commercials"/ powerpoint slides / etc. from sports teams, clubs, etc.
- V. Safety
  - Teachers need to send students with covered backpacks/duffle bags to office. Report them document it. A lot of students selling snacks/drinks... against school/district policy. But incidents on our own campus last year and at neighboring campus this year indicates that we ought to continue to be vigilant about covered bags on campus.
