Meeting Agenda & Minutes

1. Introductions

We met a new parent member, Traci Riley, who has a student in PK this year and our new community member, Amy Maddux.

2. Updates

- Enrollment
 - PK applications are due on April 3.
 - The lottery takes place on May 20th and June 3rd.
 - We currently have 29 students enrolled for kinder.

- Hiring
 - We are currently hiring for:

- We have scheduled 6 interviews so far and are still looking for interested candidates.
- Open transfer period begins April 26th.
- PK & K teachers have been invited to sit in on interviews and review application materials to provide feedback.
- Garden
 - Exxon volunteers have been growing seedlings from home and begin planting them in our garden beds. The main focus is growing vegetables. Ms. Lee will work on a water schedule and Ms. Mijares expressed interest with her class getting involved with the garden.
- 3. After School Care 2021-2022
 - Existing programming:
 - o Hours: 3:15 5:30pm
 - o Maximum students: 25 35
 - Led by: Mr. Lozano
 - Facilitated by Love ES teachers
 - Cost approx. \$9/day
 - Concerns:
 - Program maximum may not meet demand of growing campus
 - Program is not led by certified personnel
 - Received feedback that parents need care until 6pm
 - Outside vendors often offer additional classes such as karate, chess, ballet, etc.
 - An outside vendor, After 3 presented their program offerings.
 - If we were to choose to move forward with After 3, this could open up opportunities for us to pay teachers to host after school clubs such as:
 - Spelling Bee
 - Choir/Band
 - Robotics
 - Tutorials, etc
 - Several SDMC members expressed concern about the cost of After 3. We also discussed Love Park as an affordable alternative.
 - We were not able to identify a certified staff member who was willing to take on the running of our existing after care program.
 - We voted:
 - 9 members chose to move to an outside program
 - 3 members abstained
 - <u>UPDATED TO ADD</u>: After 3 was willing to lower the price to reflect our existing program prices (taking into account the additional hour of care provided).



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- 4. End of Year Purchases
 - Each grade level was given \$2,000+ to spend on instructional items.
 - Ancillary teachers and counselor were each given \$1,000 to support their program.
 - Library was allotted \$10,000 to make updates on books.
 - SpEd was able to spend \$6,000 to support their classrooms.
 - Additional purchases made include:
 - Accelerated Reader subscription for grades K 5
 - Stemscopes Eng/Span Science curriculum grades K 5
 - Scholastic News subscription
 - Book bags for each child
 - Spirit shirts for purchase (free for incoming students)
 - Over \$11,000 spent on Spanish books for classroom libraries
 - \$10,000 spent on English books for classroom libraries
 - Book bins purchased for each grade level
 - Classroom rugs
 - General supply replenishment
 - o Updated marquee with digital display and new logo
 - CleverTouch display boards for each classroom
 - USB Document cameras for each classroom
 - HP Elitebooks (G6 model)
 - Docking stations for each teacher
 - Poster Maker
