- a) Key Action 1: Indicators of Success
 - i) ELA Goals-Meets 35% to 42%
 - ii) Masters 11% to16%
- b) Key Action 2: Indicator of Success
 - i) Math Goals-Meets from 38% to 43%
 - ii) Masters-11%-16%
 - iii) Effective on grade level instruction through Eureka Math Curriculum to close achievement gaps
- c) Key Action 3: Indicators of Success
 - Special Populations-Increase teacher capacity to design and tailor high quality in special populations with a key focus on Special Education.
 - (1) Sped Students-80% will grow on Map Assessments

III. State of the Schools:

a) STAAR Results from 2022-2023

- i) Strengths:
 - (1) 3rd Spanish reading decreased DNM by 17% and increase Masters by 11%
 - (2) Math went up in 1% in approaches and meets
 - (3) Science improved by 2% in approaches and 4% in meets
 - (4) Decreased DNM in Science for SPED students by 21\$
 - (5) TELPAS-Changed 4th grade to Transition/early exit
 - (6) Attendance is currently at 95.6% year to date

ii) Areas of Opportunities 2022-2023

- (1) ELA data decreased
- (2) Math Masters decreased by 5%
- (3) Science Master decreased by 1%
- (4) Mastery for SPED students in all content areas has been below standard
- (5) TELPAS
 - (a) 21-22----46% Progress Rate
 - (b) 22-23----32% Progress Rate
- (6) Attendance went down 1% from 92.9% to 97.1%

iii) Demographics

- (1) At 796 students total this semester
 - (a) African American-25% population
 - (b) Hispanic-73% population
 - (c) White/Asian/Other-0.6% of population
 - (d) At-Risk-50.4%
 - (e) EB/EL-48.6%
 - (f) Eco-Dis:94.5%(Title I Campus)
 - (g) Special Ed-11.1%
 - (h) GT-2.1%
 - 1. Goal is to identify more GT students

- iv) Goals for 2023-2024 for campus to receive an "A" Grade rating for Accountability by grade level & teacher breakdown
 - (1) Approaches-82%
 - (2) Meets-53%
 - (3) Masters-23%
- v) 21-22 school year we were at a "B" rating school
- vi) We will focus on Comprehensive Student Tracker for each grade level to track progress on all testing and attendance throughout the school year.
