2009-2010

Attached is a copy of the District and School Student Success Initiative (SSI) performance report for 2009–2010. This memo provides the English and Spanish combined districtwide results from the three administrations of the fifth and eighth grade reading TAKS and the fifth and eighth grade math TAKS. The number and percent of students that passed were calculated for each of the administrations by subject. A cumulative count of students tested combining these three administrations was also calculated by subject and grade.

Some of this year's highlights are as follows.

- The cumulative rate based on the April cohort of the 13,190 fifth-grade students assessed for reading showed that 91% passed the TAKS subtest, which was up from 90% in 2009. The math passing rate for the April cohort of 13,249 fifth graders was 94%, up from 93% in 2009.
- The cumulative rate based on the 11,172 eighth-grade students assessed for reading was 92%, down from 93% in 2009. The math passing rate for the April cohort of 11,171 eighth graders was 85%, up from 82% in 2009.

Introduction

Program Description

The Student Success Initiative (SSI) was created by the 76th Texas Legislature in 1999 to ensure that all students receive the instruction and support they need to be academically successful in reading and mathematics. Under the SSI grade advancement requirements, students are required to pass the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) grade 5 reading and mathematics tests to be promoted to sixth grade. Additionally, students are required to pass the TAKS grade 8 reading and mathematics tests to be promoted to ninth grade. As specified by these requirements, a student may advance to the next grade level only by passing these tests or by unanimous decision of his or her grade placement committee that the student is likely to perform at grade level after additional instruction. As of 2009–10, grade 3 Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) scores were no longer included in the Student Success Initiative requirements for promotion to the next grade.

Within the Houston Independent School District (HISD), the first administration of the reading and mathematics TAKS to students in fifth and eighth grade was given on April 6–7, 2010. If unsuccessful after the first administration, students received additional state-mandated instruction and took the reading and/or mathematics tests again on May 18–19, 2010. A Grade Placement Committee (GPC) addressed students unsuccessful on the second administration of the reading and/or math sections of the TAKS. The GPC created an educational plan based on the instructional needs of each student. These students were given a third opportunity to pass the TAKS during summer school on June 29–30, 2010 for math and reading, respectively. Fifth and eighth-grade students who did not pass the reading and math TAKS after the third opportunity will automatically be retained. However, parents can appeal these results to the GPC, and the committee may decide to promote an individual student if there is consensus that the student is likely to succeed in the next grade.

This report provides the districtwide results from the third administration of the fifth and eighth-grade reading and mathematics TAKS. The number and percent of students that passed were calculated for each of the three administrations. A cumulative count of students tested combining these three administrations was also calculated. This combined count included the results from the following students:

- Students who passed the first administration,
- Students who did not pass the first administration and retook the test during the second and third administrations.
- Students who did not pass the first administration and did not retake the test, and
- Students with a test document for the first administration who took the TAKS for the first time during the second or third administrations.

Results

In the following tables, the results from Spring and Summer 2010 TAKS in grades five and eight are presented as the percentage of students passing reading and mathematics. In the tables, the results of the English and Spanish versions of the TAKS are combined for fifth-grade students, and the results of the English version is for eighth-grade students. Rates from the first, second, and third administrations are presented along with a cumulative passing rate.

- On the third 2010 reading TAKS administration, 1,292 fifth-grade students were assessed. Of these students, 27% met the 2009–10 state passing standard (**Table 1**).
- When a cumulative rate for the combining of data from all three administrations was calculated based on the April cohort, the results indicated that, of the 13,190 HISD students assessed in grade five, 91% passed the reading TAKS and met the state-mandated requirements of the SSI. A total of 1,146 fifth graders did not pass reading.
- The cumulative results for the White cohort indicated that 99% met the reading requirements of the SSI, while 93% of the African American cohort, and 89% of the Hispanic cohort passed the fifthgrade reading TAKS after the final administration (**Table 1**).

- In 2010, the cumulative reading passing rate for fifth-grade students on the TAKS increased by one percentage point compared with the rate achieved by HISD fifth-grade students in 2009 (from 90% to 91%).
- The cumulative results for the African American, Hispanic, Economically Disadvantaged, and Limited English Proficient (LEP) cohorts increased over the two years by at least one percentage point. The Special Education cohort had the biggest increase in 2010 with an eight percentage point gain from 2009. The White cohort was the only cohort that showed no increase but they remained constant with a 99% passing rate (**Table 2**).

- On the June 2010 math TAKS administration, 848 fifth-grade students were assessed. Of these students, 28% met the 2009–2010 state passing standard (**Table 3**).
- When a cumulative rate for the combining of data from all three administrations was calculated based on the April cohort, the results indicated that 13,249 HISD fifth-grade students were tested. Of these students, 94% passed the math TAKS, while **811 students did not pass math**.
- The cumulative results for the White cohort indicated that 97% met the requirements of the SSI, while 91% of the African American cohort, 94% of the Hispanic cohort, and 93% of the Economically Disadvantaged cohort passed the fifth-grade math TAKS. Of the Special Education cohort 82% met the standard, while 92% of the LEP student cohort met the standard (**Table 3**).

- In 2010, the cumulative math passing rate for fifth-grade students on the TAKS increased by one percentage point compared with the rate achieved by HISD fifth-grade students in 2009 (from 93% to 94%).
- The White cohort was the only group that showed a decrease in the cumulative math passing rate for fifth-grade students in 2010 with a two percentage point decrease over the previous year. The Special Education cohort had the largest increase this year with a five percentage point gain over the previous year (**Table 4**).

• On the June 2010 reading TAKS administration, 684 eighth-grade students were assessed. Of these students, 19% met the 2009–2010 state passing standard (**Table 5**).

- When a cumulative rate for the combining of data from all three administrations was calculated based on the April cohort, the results indicated that 11,172 HISD eighth-grade students were tested. Of these students, 92% passed the reading TAKS, while **854 students did not pass reading**.
- The cumulative results for the White cohort indicated that 99% met the requirements of the SSI, while 92% of the African American and 91% of the Hispanic student groups passed the reading TAKS (**Table 5**).

- In 2010, the cumulative reading passing rate for eighth-grade students on the TAKS decreased by one percentage point compared with the rate achieved by HISD eighth-grade students in 2009 (from 93% to 92%).
- The cumulative results for the African American, Hispanic, Economically Disadvantaged, and Special Education cohorts decreased over the two years by one percentage point. The LEP cohort had the only increase in 2010 with a two percentage point gain from 2009. The White cohort had a 99% met standard rate, which remained constant from the previous year (**Table 6**).

- On the June 2010 math TAKS administration, 1,396 eighth-grade students were assessed. Of these students, 16% met the 2009–2010 state passing standard (**Table 7**)
- When a cumulative rate for the combining of data from all three administrations was calculated based on the April cohort, the results indicated that 11,171 HISD eighth-grade students were tested. Of these students, 85% passed the math TAKS, while 1,700 students did not pass math.
- The cumulative results for the White cohort indicated that 94% met the requirements of the SSI, while 79% of the African American cohort and 85% of the Hispanic cohort passed the eighth-grade math TAKS (**Table 7**).

- In 2010, the cumulative mathematics passing rate for eighth-grade students on the TAKS increased by three percentage points compared with the rate achieved by HISD eighth-grade students in 2009 (from 82% to 85%).
- The cumulative results for the African American, Hispanic, Economically Disadvantaged, and LEP cohorts increased by at least two percentage points from the previous year. The Special Education cohort had the largest increase with an eight percentage point gain from 2009. The White cohort was the only cohort that decreased from the prior year, with a one percentage point loss (**Table 8**).

A complete listing by campus of the SSI results has been attached to this report. While the data used for the districtwide analysis in the memo come from the summary data sheets, the data for the campus-level report uses the electronic data file provided by the Texas Education Agency (TEA). This electronic data file may differ slightly from the campus summary sheets due to the score code changes sent to TEA by campuses. These changes may not be captured in the electronic data file sent to HISD by TEA.
