- 1. We use a variety of instructional tools and strategies to implement the TEKS. We utilize small group instruction in all content areas students' individual needs. Teachers differentiate instruction in all content areas to ensure that we are meeting our students where they are but also growing them as learners. Students are engaged in hands on learning activities that support learning.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences annually during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held during the teacher conference periods at the parent or teacher's request.
