- ⇒ AP Biology (Mixed Grade Levels): Please read "Your Inner Fish" by Neil Shubin and complete the accompanying packet posted on the HAIS website.
- Pre-AP Biology (Class of 2024): Please read "The Hot Zone" by Richard Preston and complete the accompanying packet posted on the HAIS website.
- ⇒ AP Chemistry (Mixed Grade Levels): I do appreciate you enrolling in this college level course. To get ready for this rigorous course, complete your AP Chemistry summer assignment posted on the HAIS website. This assignment is the stepping stone to be successful in AP Chemistry.
- ⇒ Pre-AP Chemistry (Class of 2023): Welcome to the world of chemistry! Chemistry is all about the composition and changes in matter around us. To become familiar with chemistry, work on your chemistry summer assignment and know the periodic table of elements. Download or print your chemistry summer assignment from the Class of 2023 Microsoft Team.

- ⇒ AP Human Geography (Class of 2024): This year's summer assignment will be documentary and essay based. You will get to watch different movies/documentaries that touch on the many concepts that you will study throughout the year.
- Political Science I (Class of 2023): Take the Political Coordinates test and compare your results to the 2020 presidential candidates and the media bias chart. Complete the written reflection survey based on your results from the test and your thoughts.
- ⇒ Practicum in Business Management (Class of 2021): It is mandatory that all rising seniors email or call Mr. Smith to set up a meeting with him during June or July for internship interviews or conferencing to assist in locating an internship. All Internships must be approved by Mr. Smith prior to August 1, 2020. Students will receive the requirements for their Senior Capstone Project during this meeting as well as any necessary forms and documentations for their internship.

⇒ Principles of Government and Public Policy (Class of 2024): Create
