## Parent and Family Engagement Policy 2024-2025

#### **PURPOSE:**

Margaret L. Wisdom High School believes that parents play a vital role in education. When parents are engaged and involved students, parents, families, teachers, schools and the community at large benefit. Margaret Long Wisdom High School believes that students' academic achievement requires that parents understand curriculum, academic achievement standards, assessments, district/school policies and procedures, and how to monitor their children's progress and work with educators to improve the achievement of their children.

#### PART 1. GOALS

Margaret L. Wisdom High School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- Consistent with section 1118, the school will work to ensure that the required school level parental involvement policies meet the requirements of section 1118 of the ESEA, and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with section 1118(d) of the ESSA.

- Margaret L. Wisdom High School will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents and family
  members, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental and family engagement policy. The
  evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents and family members in parental and family
  engagement activities (with particular attention to parents and family members who are economically disadvantaged, are
  disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background).
