In Science, Technology, and Math this week:



In Chemistry, we will have a quiz and review for test on Wednesday/Thursday. After the test, we will begin the mole concept.

Physics students will be studying Newton's laws of motion

Geometry students will use properties of mid-segments and write coordinate proofs.

Pre-Calculus students will solve polynomial and rational inequalities algebraically and graphically.

AP Calculus students will find relationship between the increasing and decreasing behavior of f and the sign of f'.

Biology students explain viral lytic and lysogenic cycles, and the role of viruses in causing diseases such as HIV and influenza.

Students in Algebra I will begin solving quadratics; students in Algebra II will study factoring and graphing quadratics.
