What's Happening at HAIS the week of November 7, 2016

#### In Science, Technology, and Math this week:

Geometry students will use inequalities to make comparisons in two triangles.

Pre-Calculus students will find the complex zeros of a polynomial.

AP Calculus students will use implicit differentiation to find the derivative of an inverse functions.

In Geometry students will Prove Triangles Congruent by SSS, SAS, ASA, AAS, and HL.

In Algebra II students will Graph Quadratic Equations in Standard and Vertex Forms and Solve Quadratic Equations by Factoring.

In Statistics students will begin the study of Probability by learning to Use Random Numbers to Simulate Problem Situations.

Students in Biology will describe the stages of the cell cycle, including DNA replication and mitosis, and the importance of the cell cycle to the growth of organisms.

Algebra I students will perform function analysis and make predictions using regression.

#### Here's What's Happening in the Humanities this week:

Students APUSH will identify, trace, analyze, and evaluate why the Old South chose to secede in 1860.

In English I, students will continue working on grammar and begin working on their first expository essay!

In MUN, students will move on from human rights to specifically the rights of children.

Huzzah! This week the ELA class will be drawing on their recently completed knowledge of Macbeth, and the Renaissance time period to produce a short show for Act V. Then we'll be moving onto work with themes, and symbols as we plan, and draft Macbeth Essays. Finally, students will be putting themselves in the shoes of their recently written characters to begin writing a monologue.

Our gentle lords and ladies were mystified by the wonder of the Renaissance Festival last week. In the coming weeks we will take what was seen and relate it to the Calamitous 14th Century and how the "Dark Ages" gave way to the light during the Renaissance Era. Be ready to be enlightened by the ideas of how science, math and politics changed and the impact that those changes had on the world. Also mark Nov. 15 on your calendar as Humanities Night, a celebration of the humanities and their impact on our students.

Students in AP Human Geography will explain the concepts of political power and territoriality and the structure of the contemporary political map.
