


Friday, November 9, 2018

## English



⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will complete the HSCA 03 test and begin work on their *Macbeth* RAFT writing project.

⇒ **AP/1301 English Language and Composition:** Students will continue to work on their Creative Writing Project, coinciding with National Novel-Writing Month.

- ⇒ **English III:** Students will begin drafting their own original play about a societal issue of their choosing.
- ⇒ **AP/2322 English Literature and Composition:** Students will finish their unit on Arthurian legends and begin *The Canterbury Tales*.
- ⇒ **English IV:** Students we will be reading *Hamlet* and examining Shakespeare's influence on the English language and his themes about human nature that hold true hundreds of years later.
- ⇒ **Business English:** Students will continue their exploration of rhetoric and persuasive speaking/writing. On Friday, students will take a field trip to the Asia Society to experience the "Cartographies" exhibit and make connections to their work on the global refugee crisis.
- ⇒ **Creative Writing:** Students will continue to work on their writing portfolios.

## Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will be able to solve systems of equations using graphs and tables.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will be able to construct the proof that the sum of the measures of the angles of a triangle is 180 degrees.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Kim):** Students will use properties of midsegments and write coordinate proofs.

- ⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will solve polynomial and rational inequalities algebraically and graphically.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will use a derivative to solve optimization problems.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will use antiderivatives to find position or velocity in rectilinear motion with initial conditions given.
- ⇒ **College Algebra (Dual Credit):** Students will be able to graph exponential functions.

## Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will take their Collaborative District Quiz and will partake in a mutation lab.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will learn about mole concept.

- ⇒ **AP/Pre-AP Physics:** Students will complete unit 4 of the master course.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will learn about mitosis and meiosis.
- ⇒ **Scientific Research and Design:** Students will finish their unit on the nervous system and the anatomy of the brain.

## Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will be finishing up our migration unit. Students received a study guide last week that needs to be completed and turned in on the day of their test. A-Day testing will be on Wednesday, November 14, and B-Day testing will be on Thursday, November 15. Please encourage your student to begin studying now.

- ⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be learning how to write a Document Based Question and comparing post-classical East Asian Empires.
- ⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students are learning about the 1920s.
- ⇒ **Economics (HAIS):** Students are learning about personal finance.
- ⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students are connecting 21st century issues with governmental concepts.

⇒ **Chinese I:** Students will be able to talk about their family members and their personalities.

- ⇒ **Computer Science:** Students will work on SNAP programming, shapes, and quadrilaterals.
