What's Happening at HAIS the week of February 16, 2015



In Science, Technology, and Math this week:

Biology: students will conclude lesson on "Biological Processes" and begin dissecting body systems such as the endocrine, nervous, and reproductive systems. Students will complete lab dissections and inquiry activities.

AP/Dual Credit Biology: students will continue studying kingdoms protist, plantae, and animilia. Students will complete lab inquiry.

AP Physics: students will examine DC and parallel circuits. Students will also study Ohm's and Kirchoff's Laws.

Physics: students will analyze states of matter. Students will also visit topics of pressure, the Ideal and Combined Gas Laws and take

a snapshot #4 test.
Science R&D: students will research thermal energy and home insulation.

Chemistry: students will examine gases and Gas Laws.

AP/Dual Credit Chemistry: students will continue study on chemical equilibrium.

Algebra 1: students will solve quadratic equations by factoring.

Geometry: students will use sine, cosine, and tangent ratios to solve problems.

Pre-Calculus: students will convert between degree and radian measures of angles.

AP Statistics: students will make Confidence Intervals and Hypothesis Tests for proportions.

Algebra 2: students will write exponential and power functions. AP Calculus: students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.

Here's What's Happening in the Humanities this week:

English I: students are writing short answer question responses, learning about monologues and soliloquies, and reading Act II, Scene 1 in A Raisin in the Sun.

English II: students are following a step by step process for writing a persuasive essay with reference to Ender's Game.

Business English: students are taking a quiz over vocabulary from their SAT list and from their reading. Students are also continuing to read from Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's *The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes*. As they read, they are determining the meanings of vocabulary words from context, summarizing and speculating over major events, and exploring different points of view.

AP Language: students are reading and annotating Thoreau's essay on "Civil Disobedience," studying vocabulary from the text, and answering reading comprehension and analytical questions about the text.

AP Literature: students are being assessed on their understanding of *Frankenstein* vocabulary and starting research on *Hamlet* and the life of William Shakespeare.

AP Human Geography/World Geography: students will analyze geopolitics at a global scale.

Model UN: students are preparing for National High School Model United Nations Conference, New York. The Social Studies department will be hosting a Delegate workshop on Saturday, February 21 from 10:00AM to 12:00PM. Sign-up in room 102.

AP World History: students will continue composing and practicing how to write a Document Based Question (DBQ) Essay and begin Industrialization and Global Integration in world history.

U.S. History: students will construct the American domestic and foreign policies during World War II by analyzing primary sources. Economics: students will identify trends in the labor market and apply the basic principles of defining the housing market(s).
