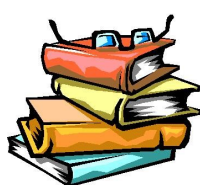

## English



⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will continue leading the class through the exploration of a variety of topics.

⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition (Shepard):** Students are taking their final exam in this course over two days this week. Good luck to Ms. Shepard's 1302 class!

⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition (Gillespie):** Students will take their HCC final exam on May 6 (A Day)/May 7 (B Day). Students will then spend time reviewing for their AP exam, which is on May 15.

⇒ **English III:** Students will continue to read and analyze *The Grapes of Wrath* by John Steinbeck.

⇒ **Business English:** Service Learning Capstone groups are in the final weeks of completing their projects and preparing to present their capstones at the Asia Society on May 23 and 24.

⇒ **AP/2323 English Literature and Composition:** Students will take their HCC final exam on May 6 and will take their AP exam on May 8.

⇒ **English IV:** Seniors are preparing to write their final exam by reading selected works from the British literary canon and connecting them to the literary period in which they were written.

⇒ **Creative Writing:** Students will work on original projects of their choice, as well as their writing portfolios for the semester, which will be due during finals week.

## Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will factor trinomials of the form  $ax^2 + bx + c$ .

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will calculate the areas of sectors of circles.

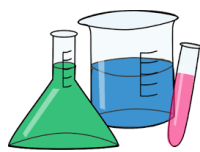
⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will find the limit of the polynomial.

⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.

⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will find a derivative defined as the limit of the difference quotient.

⇒ **College Algebra (Dual Credit):** Students will take their final exam.

## Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will review for the Biology STAAR EOC exam on May 10.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will review molarity, acids, and bases.

⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will start reviewing for their HCC final exam.

## Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will continue to review and have access to study material via their OneNote (APHuG review section) and their Kaplan book.

⇒ **AP World History:** Students will continue to review for the AP exam on May 16.

⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students are reading and analyzing primary source documents by historical era.

⇒ **Economics (HAIS):** Students are completing notes and reviewing for the final.

⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students are completing notes and reviewing for the final.

## Fine Arts, CTE, LOTE, PE



⇒ **Theatre Arts I:** Students will continue rehearsing their HAIS School Musicals.

⇒ **Principles of Government and Public Policy:** Students will read *Gutter v. Bollinger* and begin applying the precedents discussed in class to a real-world situation in preparation for their final exam.

⇒ **Political Science:** Students will finish writing their Supreme Court opinion based on a case regarding 4th Amendment protections against search and seizure.
