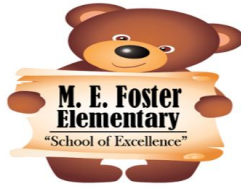

Notes/Minutes: Principal reviewed the school data and mentioned to the committee that the district level



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assessments were currently being given on campus. That data would be added to the data spreadsheet the committee received. Principal reviewed the priority school grant money and the few changes that were made regarding the allocations of the monies. The committee had a question about tutorials for primary students. The school is currently coming up with a system to potentially pay K – 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teachers to tutor students during ancillary time. The additionally funds that the school will receive will go towards extra duty pay (tutorials for teachers) and general supplies. The next big school fundraiser will be March 31<sup>st</sup> put on by the 5<sup>th</sup> grade team to raise money for their 5<sup>th</sup> grade trip. ABC dental agreed to sponsor cups, syrup, and a snow cone machine. They also agreed to sponsor a moon walk, maybe 2. A committee member agreed to reach out to the fire station to see if they could come, as well as to the local radio station to see if they could publicize the event. The event will be open to the public, and items will be purchased by tickets only. Tickets will be sold after school before the event, as well as during the event. Another fundraiser was brought up by the coordinator of the DADs program including selling cakes. Students would purchase the cakes and decorate them for their mothers for Valentine's Day. Mothers' Day was also brought up as a potential day. STEM Night will be March 9<sup>th</sup> and ABC dental was invited to set up a parent information table. The DADs program will take place February 2<sup>nd</sup>. The coordinator asked the committee about archery and mentioned that he was trying to get Foster ES dads certified to teach archery to our students. He wants to get a grant to purchase the archery equipment. Another committee member brought up events for Moms, due to some of them continuing to show up to Dads day. The committee mentioned that there are a lot mothers active and that the emphasis was to get more dads to participate.
