## 1. Welcome

## 2. Budget - State of the School

- a. Enrollment: 709
- b. Attendance YTD: 95.41%
- c. Virtual vs. In-Person for the 5<sup>th</sup> six weeks: ~60% IP 40% RV but the number is constantly changing  
As of 3/24, Ray K. Daily's enrollment is no longer capped. New students are allowed to enroll. Actual IP – 61%

## 3. Instruction

- a. September 8 – October 16 – virtual
- b. October 19 – June 11 – In-person or virtual (parent choice every 6 weeks)
- c. STAAR assessments Virtual students are not required to take STAAR assessments. However, virtual families can decide that their child takes the STAAR assessments. Interested virtual families should contact school so RKD can plan to accommodate the requests. A STAAR survey will be sent to families.

## 4. Review 2020 – 2021 SIP

- a. HB3 House Bill 3 (HB3) include plans that target early childhood (EC) literacy and math. Daily Elementary is using Ren 360 and Imagine Learning and tracking its usage.
- b. Math with in person and virtual learners, it is more difficult to monitor.
- c. Reading with in person and virtual learners, it is more difficult to monitor.
- d. Quarterly Review of SIP Goals – discuss and complete on the document Daily Elementary is monitoring SIP Goals.

## 5. Staff Development

- a. Kindergarten and Principal – year long Texas Reading Academy Training – 60 hours of coursework and video exemplars; next year will be 1<sup>st</sup> grade teachers and assistant principals
- b. All other employees, as needed trainings throughout the year with no more formal PD days in the calendar. This is a good training but is very intense. Program involves methods/strategies for teaching students how to read.

## 6. Other School Events Concerns

- a. Missed days due to this weather event will not be made up.
- b. However, if there is any other reason for school to be cancelled (i.e. Spring Floods), then the school year will have to be extended past the students' final day of Friday, June 11.
- c. 2021 – 2022 Registrations – April 14 – all registration windows will be posted.
- d. Spark Park at Daily In the planning stages. Committee has met. Ms. Norris and Ms. Tiet discussed parent interest

Additional topics brought up:

- Ms. Jones asked about dress code plans for 2021/2022 school year. She asked if we were required by district to follow a prescribed dress code or if a more relaxed dress code of “free dress” was allowed. Ms. Jones enjoys seeing the student’s individuality of dress this year.
- Ms. Viktorin shared an observation of short length of girls after spring break.
- Teacher Appreciation 2021 was discussed. Ms. Norris shared that parents may want to participate. Ideas included offering non-monetary options or decreasing the options were discussed.
- A parent of a returning student asked if she could purchase Daily Shirts. Ms. Norris responded yes but must be a cash sale by Daily Staff. Polo shirts \$15 and Spirit shirts \$10
