I. Campus Improvement Goals

The committee examined the performance indicators for the students' academic achievement. The committee members shared indicators by grade level and across grade level. Members discussed strategies to address student needs and impact student achievement. The committee decided that the teachers should continue after school tutorials and Saturday school to further prepare students for the STAAR test.

II. Parental Involvement
