



The percentage of 3rd grade students performing at or above grade level in reading as measured by the Meets Grade Level Standard on the STAAR will increase 8 percentage points from 42% in June 2019 to 50% in June 2024.

Superintendent's Response:

For Goal 1, the district EXCEEDED the target of 44% of 3rd grade students performing at or above grade level as measured by the Meets Grade Level Standard on the STAAR by 2 percentage points.

There were three groups who did not meet the target: Hispanics, Asians, and English Learners. While these groups did not meet the growth target, they all outperformed prior year performance on the STAAR.

GPM 1.1: Based on the MOY screener, first grade students improved their performance in reading by 11% from the BOY screener. Hispanic students saw the largest gain from BOY to MOY, and all groups saw improvement from the BOY to MOY.

GPM 1.2: Based on the MOY screener, second grade students improved their performance by 8% from the BOY screener. Hispanic students saw the greatest improvement from the BOY to the MOY.

GPM 1.3: Based on the MOY screener, third grade students improved their performance by 5% from the BOY screener. Hispanic students also saw the largest improvement in 3rd grade from BOY to MOY.


Next Steps: We have now had a cohort of teachers complete training in the Science of Teaching Reading and we continue to train another cohort of teachers and leaders. In addition to this training, we have now had systematic phonics instruction in place for over one year. Finally, next year we will have 40 schools implementing Amplify reading, which in addition to a robust English phonics program, also has Spanish phonics which will continue to help improve performance among our English learners.



Percentage of 1st Grade Students Reading At or Above Benchmark (40th Percentile) By RISE Campus Status




