Course Description

This course is designed for students who have Chinese I foundation. Students will start a journey of Chinese language and culture by participating in class activities, completing assignments, projects and cultural events. In addition, interaction with native Chinese speakers is a critical part of this course. When completing this course, students will be able to master skills in Chinese language listening, speaking, writing, and reading in an intermediate level.

Grading Criteria

Your grade for this course will be based on a percentage of the following:

Daily Work/Homework	10%
Formative Assessment	50%
Summative Assessment	40%

Within each 9 weeks, there will be 2 summative assessments, 9 formative assessments, and 7 daily assignments.

***If you have missing assignments or grades below 70, you will have only **ONE** calendar week to make up the assignment or grade.

Class Rules

1. Sit in classroom before bell rings. Tardiness will be marked once bell stops ringing. Absence will be marked if a student is unable to show up within 20 minutes after the bell rings.
2. Get prepared for class:
 - Get your journal from the basket that is labeled with your period number. Get your envelope from the white container with your period number on it.
 - Pass out the graded work from the basket.
 - Copy down objectives that are on the smartboard on your journal.
 - Work on *Warm up* that are on the smartboard. Students are supposed to finish *Warm up* within 7 minutes and timer will be used.
 - Objectives, *Warm up* and Notes on the journals will be checked unexpectedly and graded.
3. Participate in class actively and follow the instructions.
4. Stay quiet and listen attentively when the teacher is talking. No interruption is allowed.
5. Always raise hands to get permissions from the teacher before you ask any questions.
6. Speak up in pair work, group discussion, whole classroom activities.
7. No food and drinks are allowed in the classroom except water. Leave your food and drink in the table that is next to the door and take it away when class ends.
8. Complete assignments on time. You can always get the assignment in HUB-Unit Name-Assignments
9. Respect the teacher, the other students, and guest speakers.
10. Put school supplies, envelope, journals back to the baskets and boxes when you leave the class. Pick up the trash that is around you when you leave to maintain a clean and conducive learning environment.
11. If you have missing assignments because of absences, it is **YOUR** responsibility to go to the teacher for assignments. All the missing assignment can be got on HUB.
12. No assignment that is later than 6 days will be accepted. 10% of score reduction will be applied to a delay each day.
13. All other rules and regulations found in SIS handbook also apply to this course.
