3. Safety and Security
 - a. Reminder to grade levels to be on time for ancillary, both picking up and dropping off students.

4. Budget
 - a. Student attendance is 98.2%. Last year at this time was 98.5%. Pre-K and Kinder are still at 98%.
 - b. Membership – two waivers – one in Kinder dual language, and one in second grade.
 - c. Enrollment is 935, actual physical enrollment is 933.
 - d. PEIMS snapshot on Friday, October 27. Students not attending the literature parade will go to the computer labs. Parade will be at 2:00.
5. Curriculum and Staff Development
 - a. SIP was approved by the staff.
 - b. Literacy by 3 – teachers need to continue implementing this curriculum structure with fidelity.
 - c. Over age students – report submitted to the district today. We currently have 78 over aged students at Patterson. Two students are over aged by two years. Over aged students can be on a waiver in second, third, and fourth grade; if there is a campus plan in place so the students are successful and don't fall further behind. 42% of these 78 students came to Patterson from other campuses.
 - d. IB Mission and Vision Statements
 - i. Mission Statement – Patterson Elementary strives to foster creative, internationally-minded students in a safe environment. We will accomplish this by encouraging authentic, student-driven exploration through literature, languages, and global perspectives. As a result, our students will be empathetic, balanced and principled, in solving real-world problems.

- ii. Vision Statement – Graduates of Patterson Elementary will be respectful, open-minded citizens who are reflective, curious and independent. Patterson Panthers will be caring communicators who are able to collaborate and affect positive change in the world.
 - iii. SDMC approved both vision and mission statements. These will now be presented to the staff.
 - 6. IB Showcase – 5th and 4th grade showcase/literature café – Tuesday, October 24.
 - 7. Concerns –
 - a. Teachers need to teach and reinforce correct cafeteria behavior. The teachers are also asked to take kids to the restroom before lunch, as there are too many children to take restroom breaks during lunch.
