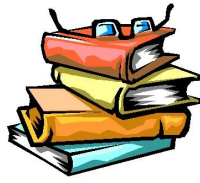


Friday, November 2, 2018

English



⇒ **Pre-AP English I:** Students will continue reading *The Hate U Give*.

⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will investigate the repercussions of killing a king in Shakespeare's *Macbeth*.

⇒ **AP/1301 English Language and Composition:** Students will begin their month-long Creative Writing Project coinciding with National Novel-Writing Month.

⇒ **English III:** Students will present their *Crucible* Mind Maps and begin their own original play.

⇒ **AP/2322 English Literature and Composition:** Students will finish their unit comparing different versions of Arthurian legend.

⇒ **English IV:** Students will present their current event articles via power point and begin their study of Shakespeare.

⇒ **Business English:** Students will be completing their Global Refugee Project presentations and starting a new unit on rhetoric and persuasive speaking.

Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will graph absolute value inequalities.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will investigate patterns in properties of parallel lines.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Kim):** Students will use properties of midsegments and write coordinate proofs.

⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will solve polynomial and rational inequalities algebraically and graphically.

⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will determine whether one function grows faster than another using limits.

⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will find the derivative and antiderivative of inverse trigonometric functions.

⇒ **College Algebra (Dual Credit):** Students will solve polynomial and rational inequalities.

Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will explore the three stages of transcription and translation.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will learn to construct electron dot formulas to illustrate ionic and covalent bonds after practicing writing chemical formulas and names.

⇒ **AP/Pre-AP Physics:** Students will study Newton's second law of motion as it applies to Atwood's machine.

⇒ **AP Biology:** Students learn about the cell cycle, mitosis, and meiosis.

⇒ **Scientific Research and Design:** Students will continue their learning on the nervous system and its divisions.

Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will continue studying migration by diving deeper into international migration and migration patterns in the US. On Friday, students will be responsible for turning their family's migration story into a comic strip. This will serve as a quiz grade.

⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be learning about the causes and effects of the spread of Islam.

⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students are beginning study of the 1920s.

⇒ **Economics (HAIS):** Students are working through personal finance issues and solutions.

⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students are reading articles related to current regulatory issues.
