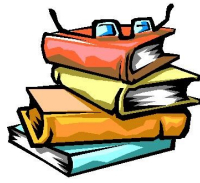


Friday, December 7, 2018

English



⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will be reviewing best practices in writing essays and finishing the unit dealing with individuals marginalized based on disability.

⇒ **AP/1301 English Language and Composition:** Students will take their HCC final exam on Monday/Tuesday, December 10/11 and will begin to preview next semester.

⇒ **English III:** Students will wrap up their original play performances and begin reviewing for their final exam.

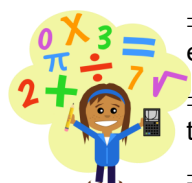
⇒ **AP/2322 English Literature and Composition:** Students will take their HCC final exam on Monday, December 10, and continue to read Shakespeare's *Hamlet*.

⇒ **English IV:** Students will be reading and analyzing scenes from *Hamlet* in preparation for their final exam in this course.

⇒ **Business English:** Students will be organizing their persuasive speeches and preparing to deliver them during final exams the following week.

⇒ **Creative Writing:** Students will work on their Semester Writing Portfolios, a component of their final exam.

Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra I:** Students will review for the final exam.

⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Nguyen):** Students will review for the final exam.

⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will solve systems of equations in three variables and start reviewing for the final exam.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will solve problems in coordinate geometry involving slope-intercept form and point slope form of the equation of a line and start reviewing for the final exam.

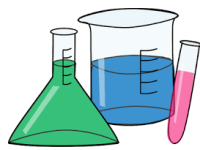
⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will review for the final exam.

⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will solve separable first order differential equations with initial conditions to show a particular solution and check for domain restrictions.

⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will determine the area of regions using definite integrals resulting from vertical or horizontal slicing.

⇒ **College Algebra (Dual Credit):** Students will solve systems of equations using matrices and start reviewing for the final exam on December 12.

Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will continue their unit on genetics and end by studying blood types.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will be given a review packet to earn 10 extra credit points on their final exam. Students will review the topics from the beginning of the semester to prepare for final exam.

⇒ **AP/Pre-AP Physics:** Students will study momentum.

⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will take their 1306, HCC final exam on Monday and conduct their final lab presentations on Wednesday.

⇒ **Scientific Research and Design:** Students will continue researching their selected disease to present to the class.

Social Studies



⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be presenting their religious conflict projects and reviewing for finals.

⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students will complete study of World War II and begin reviewing for the final exam.

⇒ **Economics (HAIS):** Students will complete study of current challenges to economic theories and begin reviewing for the final exam.

⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students will complete study of courts and civil liberties and begin reviewing for the final exam.

⇒ **Principles of Government and Public Policy:** Students will learn how to include in-text citations, provide feedback on others' writing, and revise papers.

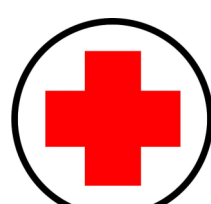
⇒ **Political Science:** Students will learn how to include in-text citations, provide feedback on others' writing, and revise papers.
