English



Pre-AP English I: Students will continue reading Animal Farm.

Pre-AP English II: Students will be working on dystopian literature and reading analysis.

⇒ AP/1302 English Language and Composition

(Gillespie): Students will write a timed persuasive essay and practice image analysis.

- ⇒ AP English Language and Composition (Shepard): Students will write their first timed persuasive essay of the new year.
- English III: Students will begin their poetry analysis unit, exploring \Rightarrow literary themes related to family.
- AP/2323 English Literature and Composition: Students will practice literary analysis essays and continue reading Shakespeare's Hamlet.
- English IV: Students will read Act 4 of Hamlet and discover new meaning from the text by comparing Shakespearean and modern language versions.
- Business English: Students will begin preparing lessons to teach their classmates on social justice issues.

Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will be reviewing operations on fractions and applying those operations to solving equations.

Pre-AP Geometry (Polley): Students will learn the differences between Euclidean and spherical geometry.

⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will use the complementary angle theorem.

- ⇒ AP Calculus AB: Students will use the first derivative to determine critical points, horizontal and vertical tangent lines, intervals of increase or decrease, and relative extrema.
- ⇒ AP Calculus BC: Students will solve rectilinear motion problems involving position, speed, velocity, and acceleration.
- College Algebra (Dual Credit): Students will review the course syllabus and learn to log in to Connect Math.

Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will complete their final exam corrections and review most missed standards.

Pre-AP Chemistry: Students will learn about percent yield and limiting reactants.

- AP/Pre-AP Physics: Students will study energy.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will learn about evolution.
- Scientific Research and Design: Students will learn to synthesize science research articles.

Social Studies



⇒ AP Human Geography: Students will be learning about imperialism. political organization, and challenges. There will also be a government vocabulary quiz.

A۲ world History: Students will be learning about the effects of the Columbian Exchange.

 \Rightarrow US History (HAIS): Students are learning about the Cold War as well as the bridge between WW2 and the Civil Rights Movement.

- **Economics (HAIS):** Students are studying the language of economics. They will also be introduced to its main concepts.
- Government (HAIS): Students are studying major governmental concepts along with learning the meaning of governmental jargon.

Fine Arts, CTE, LOTE, PE



> Principles of Government and Public Policy: Students will analyze the executive branch through the lens of the Federalist and Anti-Federalist papers. Students will also learn about different executive agencies, how they function, and their purpose.

Political Science: Students will learn about the political philosophies of ancient philosophers such as Plato, Aristotle, Cicero, and Confucius and connect

those philosophies to modern day governments.

- POFI 1341: As we start a new course, I am encouraged by all of the students who have said they are ready to put in their best effort. We will have use of two new software packages as additional resources: JasperActive + MyITLab Simulations. We will be working on Word Chapter 4: Using Styles and Creating Multilevel Lists and Charts and Word Chapter 5: Using Advanced Table Features.
- ⇒ AP Computer Science: Students will continue working on Khan Academy's computer science algorithm lesson.
- Practicum in Business Management: All seniors must sign out for \Rightarrow internships on Fridays in the Go Center before 8:30 AM.
- Theatre Arts I: Students will be looking at renaissance plays and \Rightarrow working on set design.
- PE: Students were introduced to activities, grading, and objectives for the semester.
