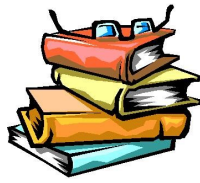


Friday, February 22, 2019

English



⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will be working on meter in poetry and essay revision.

⇒ **AP/2323 English Language and Composition (Shepard):** Students will write and revise a synthesis essay using six sources on museums to develop an original argument about the most important consideration in museum curation.

⇒ **English IV:** Based on their individual research, students will visualize BREXIT as a romantic "break-up" situation and write a Shakespearean sonnet that mirrors the rhyme scheme, meter, and form.

⇒ **Business English:** Students will explore their skills, interests, and goals to develop a proposal for their Service Learning Capstones.

Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will factor trinomials to solve quadratic equations using the Zero Product Property.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will use the midpoint and distance formulas in the coordinate plane.

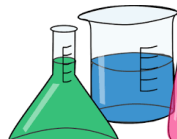
⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will graph polynomial functions using transformations.

⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will translate the symbolic representation of the definite integral to a graphical representation.

⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will formulate and use properties of definite integrals.

⇒ **College Algebra (Dual Credit):** Students will analyze graphs of piecewise defined functions.

Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will explore the endosymbiotic theory.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will take a quiz on acids and bases and turn in lab reports. Next, we will start our PBL on gas laws.

⇒ **Pre-AP/AP Physics:** Students will study electric circuits.

⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will learn about nutrition and reproduction of plants.

Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will finish economic geography by discussing global problems with industrialization and a day of review. Their exam will be March 4/5, depending on their class period. The test review will be due on the day of their test.

⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be learning about the causes and effects of second wave imperialism.

⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students are finishing their study of civil rights leaders.

⇒ **Economics (HAIS):** Students are focusing upon the concept of demand.

⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students are beginning study of participatory government.

⇒ **Principles of Government and Public Policy:** Students will learn about the process and hierarchy of the court system in the United States and hear a presentation about court procedures from a former Assistant U.S. Attorney.

⇒ **Political Science:** Students will continue to have philosophical discussions based on the readings from *The Prince* by Machiavelli.

⇒ **Theatre Arts I:** Students will be studying the modern history of theatre.

⇒ **Principles of Applied Engineering:** Students will take a summative/end of lesson electrical quiz.

⇒ **PE:** Students will play softball.
