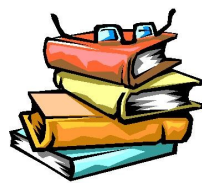


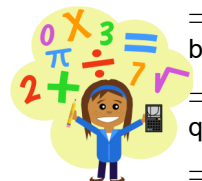

English



- ⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will be deciding in their classes what English pathway to pursue for the remainder of the semester.
- ⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition (Shepard):** Students will circle back to the Argument Essay and ADQ H.L. Mencken's position that "Man does not want to be free. He simply wants to be safe."
- ⇒ **Business English:** Service Learning Capstone projects are well underway as student groups work towards a mid-May completion date.
- ⇒ **English IV:** Students will end their supernatural voyage through the poem *Rime of the Ancient Mariner* by creating a story board incorporating Romantic elements from the poem into the narrative.

Math



- ⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will multiply binomials.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will prove when a quadrilateral is a parallelogram.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will solve trigonometric equations quadratic in form.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will use limit theorems to evaluate limits analytically, including limits of piecewise functions.
- ⇒ **College Algebra (Dual Credit):** Students will calculate roots of unity.

Science



- ⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will investigate mutualism, commensalism, parasitism, competition, and predation.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will practice problems on specific heat calculations.
- ⇒ **AP/Pre-AP Physics:** Students will study pressure.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will learn about the nervous and sensory systems and practice strategies for the AP exam.

Social Studies



- ⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will be diving deeper into our urban geography unit by covering and discussing gentrification and urban models. This unit will be taught fairly quickly because of our upcoming testing schedule. Students will have access to any notes that we are unable to complete in class. The assessment for this unit will be a mini-project that should take them roughly a day and a half.
- ⇒ **AP World History:** Students will examine the effects of globalization and modern technology.
- ⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students will review historical eras by analyzing primary source documents.
- ⇒ **Economics (HAIS):** Students will review major economics topics and work on personal finance.
- ⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students will learn about courts and civil liberties.

Fine Arts, CTE, LOTE, PE



- ⇒ **Principles of Government and Public Policy:** Students will learn about the incorporation of the Bill of Rights to the states and start analyzing and breaking down Supreme Court opinions.
- ⇒ **Political Science:** Students will read Supreme Court decisions relating to the 4th Amendment search and seizure and connect it to real world situations.
- ⇒ **Practicum in Business Management:** Students should be halfway through with their Capstone/Senior Internship Project and working on a final draft for their research paper. Presentations will begin in approximately 4 weeks.
- ⇒ **Graphic Design:** Students will work on stick, stickers, and vinyls.
- ⇒ **Computer Science:** Students will work on the shortest path.
- ⇒ **Chinese I, II, and III:** Students will create a "Why I Speak Chinese" video to win two free tickets to China.
- ⇒ **Theatre Arts I:** Students will be rehearsing their HAIS School Musicals.
