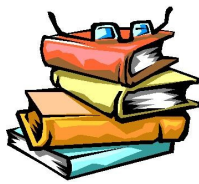


Friday, April 26, 2019

English



⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students are running the course and each class period is studying a different topic from crime to myths!

⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition (Shepard):** Students will be engaged in practicing strategies for selecting their responses to multiple choice questions on the upcoming AP exam on May 15.

⇒ **AP/1302 English Language and Composition (Gillespie):** Students will continue their Transcendentalist Authors unit while reviewing for their HCC course final May 6/7 and their AP Exam on May 15.

⇒ **English III:** Students will continue to read and discuss *The Grapes of Wrath* by John Steinbeck and explore related research questions.

⇒ **Business English:** Service Learning Capstone groups have entered the final month of service leading up to their final presentations at the Asia Society on May 23-24.

⇒ **AP/2323 English Literature and Composition:** Students will explore contemporary British literature and review for their HCC course final on May 6 and their AP exam on May 8.

⇒ **English IV:** Students will begin their final survey of the British Literature canon by choosing three works from three different literary periods they will write about for their final exam.

⇒ **Creative Writing:** Students will wrap up their Feedback Presentations and begin working on their Writing Portfolios, which will be due during HAIS finals week.

Math



⇒ **Pre-AP Algebra II (Polley):** Students will factor $x^2 + bx + c$.

⇒ **Pre-AP Geometry (Polley):** Students will measure angles using radians.

⇒ **Pre-AP Pre-Calculus:** Students will use Cramer's Rule to solve a system of three equations containing three variables.

⇒ **AP Calculus AB:** Students will formulate and use properties of definite integrals.

⇒ **AP Calculus BC:** Students will recognize a limit of a Riemann sum as the definite integral and translate to its symbolic form.

⇒ **College Algebra (Dual Credit):** Students will solve nonlinear equations in two variables.

Science



⇒ **Pre-AP Biology:** Students will investigate the causes of primary and secondary succession.

⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will start reviewing for the final exam with the concepts of percent yield and limiting reactants.

⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will review the cell cycle and molecular genetics.

Social Studies



⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will begin review for the AP exam by concentrating on the major vocabulary and theories of this course as well as practicing writing FRQs.

⇒ **AP World History:** Students will be reviewing periods 3 and 4 for the AP exam on May 16.

⇒ **US History (HAIS):** Students are reviewing primary source documents by era.

⇒ **Economics (HAIS):** Students are finishing review notes and will begin studying for the final.

⇒ **Government (HAIS):** Students are finishing review notes and will begin studying for the final.

Fine Arts, CTE, LOTE, PE



⇒ **Theatre Arts I:** Students will be on stage rehearsing their HAIS school musicals.

⇒ **Principles of Government and Public Policy:** Students will examine the equal protections clause of the 14th Amendment and its application through Supreme Court cases (UC Regents v. Blake).

⇒ **Political Science:** Students will begin to write their Moot Court Opinion based on the 4th Amendment searches and seizures restrictions they have learned in class.

⇒ **Principles of Applied Engineering:** Students will be assigned to teams to design and troubleshoot a circuit utilizing a learning kit.
